OLD BUSINESS

A. Award of Contract for Library Expansion Project - Correction of Award Amount:

The Mayor explained that this was to correct the motion for the award amount from last meeting if the Council chooses to do so. At the last Council meeting the Council was provided with wrong information, which included a \$13,000 add on and it should have been a \$3,000 add on. Discussion followed if we wanted to do more add ons, will they honor the price that was in the original bid and the City would have it in writing to have the prices honored. The \$1,100,00.00 is in our bank account as of December 29th. A motion was made by Heleker to approve the contract for the library expansion in the amount of \$1,070,025. The motion was seconded by Mussell.

A contract will be available at the next work session for the Council to review.

B. Appointment of Council Liaison to Library Board: The Council was informed that Jean Ruud is the new Chairman for the Library board. A motion was made by Hanigan and seconded by Mussell to re-appoint Kathy Dodson as Council liaison to the Library board. The motion passed by unanimous voice approval.

C. Pay request #4 – KEPHA Construction - Fire Station \$86,091.80: The Council discussed why the paperwork doesn't state city/rural on all the documents. There has been no work going on at the site recently. Mary Cordova stated that scaffolding went up today. There is other work being done at another yard. They will put up the walls before pouring the concrete floor.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Discussion of Proposed EMT Training:** Chief Clark told the Council that his department spends a lot of time responding to lift assist calls and frequently have to drive the ambulance for the EMT's which leaves the City unprotected at times. Steve Castenada and Chief Clark explained the new procedure that the fire and police have implemented. Chief Clark stated since we have 2 full time employees that work for the fire department from 8am – 5pm they will be the ones to respond to any lift assists, traffic accidents for any sort of assistance required by the EMT. Steve stated that the on duty officer each night will be paged out any time there is a traffic accident. Steve stated this will not leave the city or rural fire areas unprotected. Steve stated they have 7 people that are interested in going through the EMT training.
- B. Kit Kamo – Executive Director, SREDA:** The Council was informed that Kit Kamo is the new executive director of SREDA. Mrs. Kamo handed out information on what companies/individuals look at when making a location decision. Mrs. Kamo discussed possibly getting the City to create a map of the town and what kinds of business they would like in certain areas of town.
- C. Discussion of Annexation of 7th Avenue North Properties:** The Council was informed that when the city acquired right of way from the individuals on 7th Ave No they signed a form stating that we would not annex them until after a 24 month period. After discussion by the council it was decided to revisit the issue in 6 months.
- D. Discussion of Ordinance Regarding Liquor Licenses for Elected Officials or Employees:** The Council was informed that in our code it states no elected official or employee shall hold a liquor license in the City of Payette. The Council was also informed that Councilor Dodson has asked for a refund for overpayment on her annual business license. After brief discussion the Council asked Clerk Cordova to research this issue further with the City Attorney.

- F. Mayor's Informational Points to Council:** The Council was informed that at the next meeting the seating will be rearranged and to look for your new spot. The Council was

This agreement is entered into by and between National Hose Testing Specialties, Inc., a corporation (hereinafter known as, **National**) and **"PAYETTE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT"**, a municipal corporation, district or political subdivision of the State of Idaho (hereinafter known as, **Department**).

THIS DOCUMENT MUST BE SIGNED AND RETURNED PRIOR TO YOUR SERVICE BEGINNING

1. **Department** hereby engages **National** and **National** agrees to conduct physical inspections, pressure tests and to provide test documentation on the fire hoses of **Department**, according to the National Fire Protection Association 1962 Standard for the Care, Use, and Service Testing of Fire Hose including Couplings and Nozzles, 2003 edition (hereinafter known as, NFPA Standard).
 - a. **National** shall conduct a physical inspection, prior to pressure testing, as specified in Section 4.6 of NFPA Standard. All hoses failing physical inspection shall be tagged and removed from service, without being pressure tested. **Department** shall repair and be responsible for the service testing of all hoses failing physical inspection.
 - b. **National** shall conduct service pressure test in accordance with Chapter 7 of NFPA Standard. Service test pressure will be as specified in 7.1 of NFPA Standard, unless **Department** specifies lower service test pressure (See **Department's** Special Instructions). **National** shall not test any hoses higher than 400 psi, this being agreed with the **Department**, by the signing of this agreement.
 - c. **National**, within thirty - (30) days of completed service, shall deliver to **Department** final test documentation. Documentation provided on CD, to include date of test, service test pressure, diameter, length, identification, test results as to each length of hose and a hard copy of summary reports for all hoses. For departments desiring both CD and complete hardcopy (notebook), an additional \$150.00 fee will be charged.
 - d. **National** shall provide hydrostatic equipment required to perform **Department's** hose test.
 - e. **Department** shall provide **National** a suitable location for performance of the service test. The location shall include adequate water and electrical source for **National's** hydrostatic equipment, which water and electric power shall be provided by **Department**.
 - f. **Department** shall provide **National** a suitable area for the storage of such hoses as may require drying. **National** shall notify **Department** of hoses that require drying.
 - g. **Department** shall make available to **National** all hoses to be tested at the time and place established for the conduct of the service testing procedures and shall disclose to **National** any known defects or dangerous conditions therein.
 - h. **Department** will assemble any specialty hose packs (i.e. grass packs, forestry packs) following testing by **National**.
2. The service test dates during the term of this agreement will be established by agreement between the parties.
3. Based on the footage estimate provided to **National**, **Department** agrees to pay **National** 25 cents per foot, times 12,100 feet; with actual hose tested per documentation being used for billing which may increase or decrease rate per foot. Full payment due upon delivery by **National** of its final test documentation.
4. **Department** agrees to release and to defend, indemnify and hold **National** harmless from any claims, liabilities, demands, damages or actions for property damage, personal injury or death, and any claims incident thereto, including attorney fees and costs incurred in defense thereof, arising out of or relating to the failure for any reason of any hose tested and certified by **National** unless it can be established by clear and convincing evidence that **National** breached its obligation to test said hose and accurately report the result thereof in accordance with the terms of this contract and that said hose was not, as of the date tested, in fact capable of withstanding the standard test pressure established by the said NFPA Standard when tested according to the procedures therein.

In the event of suit or litigation arising out of or relating to this agreement, the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to recover judgment for its reasonable attorney fees as may be awarded by the Court in which such suit or action is tried, heard or decided, and any appeal therefrom.

1. **Department** hereby engages **National** and **National** agrees to conduct physical inspection, horizontal bending test, roof hook test, hardware test, strength test and to provide test documentation on the ladders of **Department**, according to the National Fire Protection Association 1932 Standard for the Use, Maintenance, and Service Testing of Fire Department Ground Ladders, 2004 edition (hereinafter known as, NFPA Standard).
 - a. **National** shall conduct a visual inspection, prior to service testing, as specified in Chapter 6.1.3 of NFPA Standard. All ladders failing visual inspection shall be tagged and removed from service, without being service tested. **Department** shall repair and be responsible for the service testing of all ladders failing visual inspection, as specified in Chapter 6.1.4.2 of NFPA Standard.
 - b. **National** shall conduct service testing in accordance with Chapter 7 of NFPA Standard. Service testing will be as specified in Chapter 7-1 of NFPA Standard, unless **Department** specifies altered service testing. (See **Department's** Special Instructions).
 - c. **National** shall inspect and replace heat sensors as in Chapter 6.2.10.1.
 - d. **National**, within thirty - (30) days of completed service, shall deliver to **Department** final test documentation. 
My name is Gilbert Gutierrez and I am the business teacher and student council advisor at McCain Middle School in Payette. My letter is in reference to our student government.

PAYETTE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT

Robert Griffiths (South)

This Lease Agreement is made and signed this 19TH day of APRIL, 2010, by and between the City of Payette, "Landlord" and Robert Griffiths ("Tenant").

1. **Background.** Landlord owns real estate at the Payette Municipal Airport which is described on the attached Exhibit A, and is also known as 2920 Airport Road, Payette, Idaho (the "Leased Premises").
2. **Grant of Leasehold.** Landlord hereby grants a leasehold interest to Tenant and Tenant hereby agrees to accept the grant of the leasehold interest and hereby agrees to pay rent and to perform the other obligations specified in this Lease.
3. **Lease Term and Holdover.** The term of this Lease shall be for the period from January 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010 (the "Lease Term"), and the stipulation that the hangar is brought to airport standards by September 30, 2010, or the lease is null and void. Any holding over after the term of this Lease, with the consent of the Landlord, shall be considered to be a tenancy from month to month. That tenancy shall be at the same rental amount as was required to be paid by Tenant for the period immediately prior to the expiration of the term of this Lease unless Landlord provided the Tenant with a 30 day notice of increase paragraph 4. c. applies. All other terms and conditions specified in this Lease shall apply.
4. **Rent.** The rent to be paid by the Tenant to the Landlord is described as follows:
 - a. \$0.11 annually per square foot of land within the Leased Premises, and it is agreed that there are 1,426 square feet of space within the Leased Premises.
 - b. Accordingly, the rent during the primary term of this Lease is \$117.39, this shall be paid in one annual payment by January 1 each year. The rent shall be adjusted annually in accordance with paragraph 4c below.
 - c. Annual CPI Adjustments. The rent to be paid during the term of this Lease shall be adjusted annually as follows: on January 1 of each year the rent payable by Tenant for the new year shall be increased by adding an amount determined by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor and Statistics Data, Consumer Price index, and shall be adjusted to reflect changes in that index.
 - d. The cash rent shall be due and payable without the necessity of any notice being given by the landlord to the Tenant, and if any payment of cash rent is late by more than 5 days the Tenant shall pay an additional \$25.00 late fee.
5. **Construction of Improvements.** Tenant shall cause to have erected and/or constructed to or on the Leased Premises the improvements described on the attached Exhibit B (the "Improvements"). The term "Improvements" also includes any structures, fixtures, additions, aprons, parking areas, taxiways/taxi lanes, landscape or any other building or site improvement located on the Leased Premises, including, without limitation, any alterations or improvements made pursuant to paragraph 13 below. Construction of the Improvements shall be commenced within six (6) calendar months of the date of this Lease Agreement, and Tenant shall diligently and reasonably proceed with such construction to completion of the Improvements. Commencement of construction shall

NON-AVIATION TENANTS AND/OR OPERATORS

STATEMENT OF CONCEPT: This Minimum Standard concerns a lease or operating agreement for the conduct of non-aviation activity on the airport, not specifically enumerated in this chapter.

MINIMUM STANDARDS

1. any person(s), firm, or entity wishing to obtain the right to conduct and/or establish such other activity shall make application to the City. Such applicant shall submit the following:
 - a. A complete description of the type of activity proposed.
 - b. A listing and description of the types of vehicles, equipment and machinery required for conduct of the activity.
 - c. Location of storage facilities for machinery, equipment and supplies.
 - d. A listing of and plan for the on site handling of any attendees, other persons, and vehicles.

2. All lease/operating agreements for such other shall include, among other things, a covenant reciting the owner's right to:
 - a. restrict, limit, or otherwise control such activity in any manner it sees fit to insure the safe and unimpeded aeronautical activity at the airport, and
 - b. designate areas for the activity and to designate the type of security required in each such areas.
 - c. such other restrictions or limitations which the Owner may deem appropriate.

3. All lease/operating agreements for such activities shall also include a covenant reciting the tenant obligation, in addition to all aforementioned obligations, to protect the general public, customers, or clients and the City from any and all damages, claims, or liability, whether by the tenant or others, relating to any monetary or other loss or damage in the conduct of any such activity resulting from or alleged to have resulted from the City's exercise of its rights and privileges, whether specifically enumerated above or not.

4. The following types of insurance are required:
 - a. Comprehensive Public Liability
 - b. Comprehensive Property Damage, including Vehicular
