Now, therefore, I, Jeffrey T. Williams, Mayor of the City of Payette, joins with WICAP in tribute to all the victims of 9/11 and the many who rose in service in response to the 9/11 terrorist attacks, will observe September 11, 2011, the 10th Anniversary of 9/11, as a voluntary day of service and remembrance; and calls upon all citizens and organizations to consider joining in this observance, to engage in activities of tribute, solemn remembrance and charitable service;

ORDINANCE 1348

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER 5.38 IN TITLE 5 TO LICENSE AND REGULATE USED CAR SALES AND USED CAR LOTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SALES; SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; ALLOWING PUBLICATION IN SUMMARY FORM; ESTABLISHING SEVERABILITY; ESTABLISHING A REPEALER; PROVIDING A PENALTY:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF PAYETTE, IDAHO:

Section 1. The Payette Municipal Code is amended by the addition of a new Chapter 5.38, entitled "USED CAR SALES AND USED CAR LOTS," which chapter shall read as follows:

Chapter 5.38

USED CAR SALES AND USED CAR LOTS

Sections:

- 5.38.010 Definitions
- 5.38.020 Established Used Car Lots
- 5.38.030 License Requirements and Procedures for Obtaining License
- 5.38.040 Regulations
- 5.38.050 Revocation
- 5.38.060 Penalty

5.38.010 Definitions

1. "Used car," as used in this chapter, means any used, pre-owned or second-hand motor vehicle to which a certificate of title or license plates have been issued and which motor vehicle has been registered for use on the highways by a purchaser, consumer or by a dealer, and includes any used or second-hand vehicle, defined as any vehicle required to be titled, trailer coaches or trailers weighing over 1,000 pounds.
2. "Used car dealer" means a person who brokers, deals or engages in the purchase, sale, lease, consignment sale or exchange of five (5) or more used cars within a 12-month period.
3. "Used car business" means the purchase, sale, lease, consignment sale or exchange by any person, firm or corporation of five (5) or more used cars within a 12-month period.
4. "Used car lot" means any place where used cars are displayed and offered for purchase, sale, lease, consignment sale or exchange in the open by a used car dealer or used car business.
5. "Established used car lot" means any land in the City of Payette maintained or used

for conducting a used car business which business was in existence at the time this chapter was created.

5.38.020: Established Used Car Lots

Any established used car lot must have:

A. A permanent structure containing not less than one hundred twenty (120) square feet of interior floor space to be used as business or sales office. Any new structure to be built shall conform to the Payette Municipal Code and the International Building Code, 2009 edition. Any existing structure shall substantially conform to standards established in the Payette Municipal Code, in regard to matters connected with public health and safety. The City Building Inspector shall cause an inspection to be made to determine such compliance.

B. Improved grounds complying with the following minimum requirements upon that portion of the land to be used for display and/or offering for sale of used cars:

1. Parking space for inventory shall be not less than ten (10) feet by twenty (20) feet for each used car.

2. Improved ground shall contain a gravel base of not less than four (4) inches covered by a minimum of two (2) inches of pavement or concrete that conforms to Idaho Department of Transportation Standards of Specifications.

3. The finished grade of such improved grounds shall be not less than twelve (12) inches or more than thirty six (36) inches above the grade of the street adjoining said premises.

4. Two driveways, one for ingress and one for egress, or one driveway adequate to permit simultaneous ingress and egress.

C. Must be in compliance with all standards of the Payette Municipal Code, including but not limited to, section 17.72.020.

5.38.030: License Requirements and Procedure for Obtaining License

No person, firm, corporation or other entity shall operate as a used car dealer or engage in a used car business within the City of Payette without a City Used Car Sales License as herein provided. A separate City Used Car Sales License shall be required for each established used car lot.

The City Clerk is hereby authorized to issue a City Used Car Sales License upon submission by the applicant of a written application on forms to be provided by the City Clerk and upon compliance by the applicant with the following requirements:

A. The application shall be accompanied by written detailed plans showing the layout of land to be used, the portion thereof to be improved as required herein, method proposed for improvement, drainage, driveways for ingress and egress, and buildings to be built or existing buildings to be used in the operation of the established used car lot.

The application shall also be accompanied by evidence that he/she has obtained all applicable zoning, use, or site plan approvals/permits required to be obtained prior to operating a used car lot or business in the proposed location in the City. The granting of a City Used Car Sales License is contingent on obtaining all applicable zoning, use, or site plan approvals/permits. The City Clerk shall submit all such plans to the City Engineer for his/her approval prior to granting of the City Used Car Sales License.

B. Applicant must furnish evidence that he/she possesses a valid State of Idaho Used Vehicle Dealer's License.

C. There shall be a one-time City Used Car Sales License fee in the amount of \$100 paid when an application is filed. There shall be no other license fees as long as in the lot remains in compliance with City Codes. In the event the City Clerk determines that the Used Car Sales lot is out of compliance with City Codes, the license shall become null and void, and before an applicant may re-commence business, there shall be a renewal application filed. There shall be a \$100.00 renewal fee paid with the application for a renewal.

No City Used Car Sales License issued under this ordinance may be transferred except upon written application by the licensee and the proposed transferee on forms to be provided by the City Clerk and the payment of a transfer fee in the amount of \$25. Provided however, the transferee shall be required to furnish any and all information as may be contained in an initial application for a City Used Car Sales License. Prior to transferring any City Used Car Sales License, the City Clerk shall determine that the established used car lot for which the City Used Car Sales License has been issued is complying with all of the provisions of this ordinance.

5.38.040: Regulations

Each licensee under this ordinance shall comply with the following regulations:

1. Keep the premises in a neat and clean condition. Dealer shall not allow any used motor vehicles that are part of its inventory to encroach upon the streets, alleys, sidewalks or other publicly maintained areas of the City.
2. Not allow any loud or boisterous noises to emanate from its place of business, either by persons congregating there or by the playing of recording instruments, radios and/or television sets or other sound-reproducing equipment.
3. At all times keep each motor vehicle used in connection with its said business or maintained as part of the inventory thereof insured with public liability and property damage insurance in an amount not less than \$10,000 per person and \$20,000 per accident, personal injury or death liability insurance and \$5,000 property damage insurance.

5.38.050: Revocation

Any City Used Car Sales License issued under this ordinance shall be automatically revoked upon termination, suspension, revocation or failure to renew the licensee's State of Idaho Used Vehicle Dealer's License or upon proof by competent legal evidence that the licensee made a false statement in any application for City Used Car Sales License filed upon this ordinance. Any such City Used Car Sales License may be revoked by the City Council in their discretion upon proof of conviction of the licensee for a violation of this ordinance.

5.38.060: Penalty

Any violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable by fine, imprisonment or both, up to but not exceeding the maximum penalties set forth in Idaho Code § 50-302, as amended.

Section 2. This Ordinance may be published in summary form allowed by Idaho Code.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by the laws of the State of Idaho.

Section 4. Any ordinances or resolutions which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only insofar as the conflict exists.

Section 5. If any portion of this Ordinance should be found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of the Ordinance shall be applied to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance.

1. **BACKGROUND & JUSTIFICATION:** The Payette County Recreation District is constructing dugouts on the McCain Middle School property at the present time and in the future building a sports complex that will include 5 bathrooms, a storage area and a concession area. They are asking the City waive the building permit fee for the two dugouts and the Conditional Use Permit fee.

FISCAL IMPACT: The approximate building permit fee for the two dugouts - \$274.00 and the Conditional Use Permit fee - \$50.00.

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend that City Council waive the building permit fee and Conditional Use Permit fee due to this project being a joint effort between Payette County Recreation District, Payette School District, Payette County and the City of Payette.

ORDINANCE NO. 1351

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, REPEALING SECTION 10.45.010 AND CREATING A NEW SECTION 10.45.010 OF THE PAYETTE CITY CODE PROHIBITING THE USE OF ELECTRONIC WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICES FOR TEXTING AND GAMING WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE; SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; ALLOWING PUBLICATION IN SUMMARY FORM; ESTABLISHING SEVERABILITY; ESTABLISHING A PENALTY; ESTABLISHING A REPEALER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 10.45.010 of the Payette Municipal code is hereby repealed and there is hereby created a new Section 10.45.010 which section shall read as follows:

10.45.010 USE OF WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICES

(A) No person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a hand held electronic wireless communications device while playing games thereon, or to write, send, or read a text based communication.

(B) "Hand held electronic communications device" includes wireless or cellular phones, PDAs, Blackberries, smart phones, laptop and notebook computers utilizing VOIP (voice over internet protocol) technology, wireless and cellular phones utilizing push-to-talk technology and any other mobile communication device that uses short-wave analog or digital radio transmissions between the device and a transmitter to permit wireless communications to and from the user of the device.

(C) As used in this section "write, send, or read a text based communication" means using an electronic wireless communications device to manually communicate with any person using a text based communication, including, but not limited to, communications referred to as a text message, instant message, or electronic mail.

(D) For purposes of this section, a person shall not be deemed to be writing, reading, or sending a text based communication if the person reads, selects, or enters a telephone number or name in an electronic wireless communications device for the purpose of making or receiving a telephone call.

(E) A violation of this section is an infraction punishable by a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

Section 2. This Ordinance may be published in summary form as permitted by Idaho Code.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by the laws of the State of Idaho.

Section 4. Any ordinances or resolutions which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only insofar as the conflict exists.

Section 5. If any portion of this Ordinance should be found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of the Ordinance shall be applied to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance.



Holladay Engineering has reviewed an application submitted by Hardin Sanitation to rezone the property in consideration to allow for maintenance and storage of collection trucks. A technical review committee (TRC) meeting was held on August 22, 2011 to discuss the submittal with the applicant. The following items represent a summary of the topics discussed at the TRC meeting.

1. Prior to construction, a site development plan shall be submitted for review and approval. The following information shall be included with the site development plan.
 - a. Grading and drainage plan.
 - b. Landscaping plan in accordance with County standards.
 - c. Plan for maintenance of the eastern area that will not be initially developed.
 - d. Proposed buildings, lighting, fencing, and other proposed improvements to the site.
2. The roadway abutting the project is under the jurisdiction of the Payette County Road and Bridge Department.
 - a. Construction of the access driveway shall remain free of curbing or sharp grade changes that would negatively affect snow removal and routine road maintenance. The developer may install a small section of guardrail over the adjacent ditch.
 - b. Typical County standards require that the roadway adjacent to a proposed development be widened to a minimum of 12 feet driving lane with 3 foot shoulders. The property under development is not adjacent to the right-of-way due to a parcel that is under the ownership of the ditch company. It does not appear that the applicant can be required to widen a roadway section onto property that is not under their ownership. Additionally, the roadway is immediately adjacent to an existing ditch. Widening of the roadway would not be possible without relocating the existing ditch. The Road and Bridge Department recommended against requiring widening of the roadway.
 - c. According to Hardin Sanitation, they currently use 10th Avenue as a primary route for trucking. Hardin Sanitation stated that the impacts from using this parcel as a central location for the trucking company will not significantly increase the traffic on 10th Avenue.

3. Access to the property is identified through the neighboring parcel. The applicant shall demonstrate that a permanent easement and/or access agreement has been established for this property.
4. The Lower Payette Ditch Company staff has reviewed the proposed access location and does not take exception to the size, material type, or proposed culvert location. The Ditch Company representatives will present the details of the application to the Ditch Company board. Correspondence from the board, approving the location and including any required conditions, shall be forwarded to the County.
 - a. To cross the ditch and/or discharge site drainage into the ditch, the applicant may need to establish a license agreement with Lower Payette Ditch Company. A copy of all required agreements shall be forwarded to the County for their files.
 - b. A letter from Payette County Road & Bridge Department dated August 23, 2011 expressed concerns about flooding and recommends that the culvert be sized the same as the crossing at Highway 95. The current proposed culvert on the concept plan is smaller than the culvert at Highway 95.
5. A review of historic photographs identified that past flooding events have directly impacted the subject property. The property does not currently appear to be within the area of special flood hazard. However, staff recommends that the applicant consider potential flooding impacts to the proposed structures and potential mitigation to reduce potential damages.
6. According to the Army Corps of Engineers in a letter dated August 10, 2011, 404 permitting will be required for this project specifically for the installation of the access road and utilities that may cross the ditch.
7. The Payette Rural Fire Department has provided a letter dated August 23, 2011 requesting a dedicated "Fire Lane - No Parking" zone and Knox box for emergency access.

STAFF COMMENTS:

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT: PCC 8-8-8 doesn't specifically list Hardin Sanitation's type of business within the permitted uses of Industrial zones. At this time staff believes the business could fit within an Industrial Zone, the inclusion of a CUP would preclude any potential appeals on that basis and allows the County to place conditions, and review upon growth of the business.

While the property is not indicated on the floodplain maps as being in the floodplain, a portion of the property did flood in the 1997 flood. Surrounding properties were required to obtain CUP's for floodplain development. I do not believe raised foundations would be a requirement but structural placement and enforcement of flood-resistant construction within the International Building Code should be considered.

8-8-8: ZONE I-1 (LIGHT INDUSTRIAL):

- A. Purpose: The purpose of the I-1 zone is to encourage the development of manufacturing and wholesale business establishments which are clean and quiet with minimal hazardous or objectionable elements such as noise, odor, dust, smoke or glare and are operated primarily within enclosed structures. This zone is further designated to act as a transitional use between heavy commercial uses and other more intense industrial uses.
- B. Uses: The following uses are permitted in all I-1 zones accompanied by an engineered plat:

1. Research activities; supply yards, building yards; sugar beet dumps; manufacturing facilities for cosmetics, pharmaceuticals, toiletries; manufacturing facilities for food products, sauerkraut, vinegar, and yeast, excluding fish or meat products; manufacturing of electrical equipment including electric signs; manufacturing of optical goods and precision instruments; above and below ground storage of bulk products; storage and sale of grain, livestock feed or fuel, provided dust is effectively controlled; wholesale houses, storage and warehouses; bag, carpet and rug cleaning, providing necessary equipment is installed and operated for the effective prevention of dust; blacksmith, welding or other metalworking shops, excluding any machine making noise to such a degree to cause a nuisance outside the physical plant; casting lightweight nonferrous metals, or electric foundries not causing noxious fumes or odors; ice manufacturing and cold storage plants, creamery and bottling plants; commercial packing sheds for farm crops; bottling works; lumberyards and cement and concrete sales establishments; dairy processing and distribution plants; commercial meatpacking plants; machine shops, plumbing shops, tin and sheet metal shops; storage warehouse, storage facilities for oil, gasoline or petroleum products. (Ord. 2009-03, 6-15-2009)

8-11-7: APPLICABLE STANDARDS:

A. Factors Considered: The planning and zoning commission and board of county commissioners shall review the particular facts and circumstances of each proposed zone change and take the following factors into consideration:

1. The compatibility of the proposed zone with surrounding uses and zones;
2. Availability of power, water, sewer, fire protection, police protection and school facilities;
3. Access to highways;
4. Burdens imposed upon taxing entities for services which will have to be provided;
5. Location in relation to floodplain and airport approaches;
6. Easements, encumbrances, adverse interests;
7. The opinions of surrounding landowners entitled to notice;
8. Availability of drainage structures and refuse disposal;
9. Opinions of other local or state agencies required to provide services or issue permits;
10. Zone change will not set a precedence for future uses incompatible with existing uses;
11. Compatibility or conflict with the comprehensive plan;
12. Any other factors relevant to the suitability of rezoning the property.

B. Written, Drafted Or Illustrated Proposals: Before permitting a reclassification of zones, the planning and zoning commission may

require a written proposal whereas streets, sewers, public utilities, curbs, gutters and anticipated future development is presented illustrating the above set forth factors. (Ord. 2009-03, 6-15-2009)

8-5-13: CONCEPTUAL PLAN:

- A. When any person shall apply for a conditional use permit, a transfer of a development right (TDR), a one lot subdivision, a rezone, a variance, or any other permit which is being sought through which an applicant will be allowed to construct a structure upon real property, the zoning administrator may require the applicant to provide a conceptual plan of a project at the time of filing of an application. A conceptual plan is intended primarily for development on a single lot. If a proposed development contains more than a single lot, a preliminary plat may be required. A conceptual plan may or may not be presented to the technical review committee.
- B. A conceptual plan may be accepted by the administrator if an application is seeking development of a single lot.
- C. All conceptual plans shall contain a notarized signature, shall address such matters as may be addressed at hearings, shall provide for a signature line for the applicant and a Payette County official, shall contain a legal description of the property, and shall be of a quality that can be recorded.
- D. Definition: A drawing less detailed than a preliminary plat, mechanically drafted to scale, showing a footprint of existing and proposed structures, access to public roadways, parking areas, easements, utilities, retention basins, setbacks and other features that may be applicable to the property. (Ord. 2008-10, 8-25-2008)

8-16-3: CONDITIONAL USE:

When authorized under the procedure provided for conditional uses in this title, the following uses will be permitted in a floodplain overlay zone:

- A. Structures used in carrying out permitted activities provided detailed engineering data is supplied by the applicant who bears the burden of proof that such structures can be located in areas of plateaus, benches or upon manmade fills or can be otherwise elevated so as not to be affected by floodwaters, provided that:
 - 1. Sewer and water systems shall be floodproofed and approved by the health authority that has jurisdiction; and
 - 2. No building or structure shall be erected and no existing building or structure shall be extended or moved unless the main floor of said building or structure is placed a minimum of one foot (1') above the elevation of the 100-year flood level. No basement floor shall be below this one foot (1') safety margin. Foundations of all structures shall be designed and constructed to withstand flood conditions at the site; and

- B. Other structures used in carrying out permitted activities provided such structures will not be subject to substantial flood damage and will not increase flood related damages on other lands. These may include structures which can be readily removed from flood hazard areas during periods of high water.
- C. Conditions that may be required by the planning and zoning commission in approving the use of structures in a floodplain overlay zone shall include:
1. Limitations on periods of use and operation;
 2. Imposition of deed restrictions;
 3. Locations and arrangement of structures within the floodway fringe areas to avoid an increase in flood heights during the recurrence of the 100-year flood discharge;
 4. Requirement for construction of channel modifications, dikes, levees and other protective measures;
 5. Placement of survey bench markers; and
 6. Floodproofing measures designed to be consistent with the flood protection elevation for a particular area:
 - a. Anchorage to resist flotation, collapse and lateral movement;
 - b. Installation of watertight doors, bulkheads and shutters;
 - c. Reinforcement of walls to resist water pressures;
 - d. Use of paints, membranes or mortars to reduce seepage of water through walls;
 - e. Addition of mass or weight to structures to resist flotation;
 - f. Installation of pumps to lower water levels in structures;
 - g. Construction of on site water supply and waste treatment systems to minimize or eliminate infiltration of floodwaters into the system and discharges from the system into floodwaters;
 - h. Pumping facilities for subsurface external foundation wall and basement flood pressures;
 - i. Construction to resist rupture or collapse caused by water pressure or floating debris;
 - j. Cutoff valves on sewage lines or the elimination of gravity flow basement drains; and
 - k. Location of on site waste disposal systems so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding.

NARRATIVE:

This 5.4 acre site is located 1818 NE 10th Avenue, about 1000 feet east of Highway 95. It lies within the Impact Area of the City of Payette. The City's plan, for this area, is depicted as light-industrial as is the Payette County Comprehensive Plan. The Lower Payette Waste Ditch abuts the property on the south side and a driveway access across the ditch will be constructed. The driveway is proposed to be twenty-four (24) feet wide with curbing or railing on each side as safety features for the public. This is proposed to be the only access to the site. Traffic is not anticipated to be significantly increased, on NE 10th Avenue, above the existing count.

Several items were considered during the research period prior to making an offer to purchase.

- (1) The site conforms to the Payette County Comprehensive Plan.
- (2) The soil is of poor quality for agricultural use but can be regraded to facilitate the proposed use and to retain the drainage on-site.
- (3) NE 10th Avenue is a primary route for our trucks to access the County Land Fill site.
- (4) The property does not lie within a FEMA designated flood zone.
- (5) Police and fire protection are readily available from either Payette City or Payette County personnel.

Hardin Sanitation employs six (6) personnel, two office staff and four drivers. A 900 square foot office is planned with a drive-thru window for convenience of the public. The setback, for the office, will be about 150 feet northerly from NE 10th Avenue to provide room for parking and traffic flow. Office hours are from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Two shop buildings are proposed. A 40'x 80' metal building for repair and maintenance, of the four (4) daily collection trucks, is planned to be located near the northwest corner of the site. Another 40'x60' metal shop for storage of the four (4) reserve collection trucks is proposed east of the repair and maintenance shop, along the northerly side of the site. Monday through Friday collection hours for two of the trucks are from 4:00AM to Noon, the other two trucks collect from 7:00AM to 5:30 PM. Outdoor security lighting will be installed on all buildings.

The majority of the site is planned to be gravel covered with storage for 15 to 20, 95 gallon containers, 6 metal containers and 20, 6 cubic yard containers. The easterly 100' to 150' being planted in pasture grass and possibly utilized for retention of on-site drainage as well as for dust and weed control. On-site services will be by a domestic well and septic tank or tanks. Public utilities will be provided by the local utility companies.

Attached herewith is the legal description of the site and also the names and addresses of the adjacent property owners within 300 feet of the project.



ORDINANCE NO.1353

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A 180 DAY MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE OR PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS TO PERMIT MINERAL EXTRACTION THROUGH OIL AND GAS EXPLORATION OR OPERATIONS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE; DIRECTING THE CITY STAFF TO INITIATE A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF THE CITY'S ORDINANCE GOVERNING PROCEDURES FOR MINERAL EXTRACTION AND OIL AND GAS EXPLORATION AND EXTRACTION AND TO PROPOSE REVISIONS THERETO; PROVIDING A PROCEDURE FOR A VARIANCE FROM THIS MORATORIUM; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON PASSAGE.

WHEREAS, the City of Payette, Payette County, Idaho (the "City"), is a municipal corporation duly organized and operating under the laws of the state of Idaho; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Payette is aware of an increased interest in oil and gas exploration and production in the Southwest Idaho area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has conducted such investigations as it deemed necessary to determine the state of regulations now applicable to oil and gas exploration and other forms of mineral extraction under the current ordinances and regulations of the City of Payette; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after due and careful consideration, has determined that the current regulations may not be adequate to address environmental and land use compatibility issues created by oil and gas exploration and mineral extraction activities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is necessary in order to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community to promulgate a set of procedural and substantive standards pending the City's investigation of the impacts of gas and oil well drilling and production in the city and its Impact Area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that it is reasonable and necessary to update municipal ordinances and regulations to provide for a fair and equitable system of regulations relating to oil and gas exploration and mineral extraction so as to

protect the property interest of mineral estate owners while protecting the rights, opportunities and property interests of surface estate owners; and

WHEREAS, it is important and necessary to preserve the status quo while a review and update of these regulations are being developed and implemented to ensure compatible land uses that do not negatively impact property values or neighborhood character; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that the staff of the City of Payette should undertake those studies or analyses necessary to prepare the appropriate recommendations for Council action; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Payette recognizes that there may be individuals or businesses who have a legitimate reason to seek a variance from the requirements of this moratorium based upon the unique needs of their project and who are able to demonstrate that the approval of their project will not defeat the purposes of the City in adopting this moratorium.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO:

SECTION 1

A moratorium is hereby imposed on the receipt, processing and approval of applications for oil and gas well permits that would permit mineral extraction and/or oil and gas exploration and extraction within the corporate limits of the City of PAYETTE. The moratorium shall be in place for one hundred eighty (180) days following the adoption of this Ordinance and may thereafter be extended by the City Council for good cause shown.

SECTION 2

The moratorium established herein shall apply to all gas wells and developments that do not have an existing oil and gas well permit for oil and gas exploration or mineral extraction under the terms of City Ordinance. Any application now in process is subject to this moratorium.

SECTION 3

The City staff are hereby directed to initiate and complete those studies and analysis necessary to determine what, if any, regulatory changes to the ordinances of the City of Payette are reasonable and necessary to permit mineral extraction and oil and gas exploration and extraction without negatively impacting the interest of surface estate owners within the City. The City Staff are directed to review all appropriate environmental, planning materials and development regulations to suggest changes, if appropriate, that would protect the interest of both mineral estate owners and surface estate owners while ensuring the highest degree of concern for the preservation of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare. The staff shall complete their work and make their recommendations to the City Council within one hundred eighty (180) days following the adoption of this Ordinance or; if they should determine that this time period is not feasible, report back to the City Council with a proposed calendar in which they will complete their work. The Staff shall solicit such input as they deem necessary and appropriate from all affected and interested parties in preparing their recommendations.

SECTION 5

Any property owner who believes that the imposition of this moratorium causes a unique and unreasonable hardship upon his or her property or business shall have the right to request a variance and shall submit a written request to the City Council by transmitting same to the City Clerk's office. The request must provide the following information:

- a. A description of the property to be covered by the variance.
- b. An explanation as to why the application of the moratorium is unreasonable as applied to the applicant's property.
- c. A description of any negative impacts created by the moratorium provision.
- d. Any property interests asserted by the applicant.
- d. A plan to insure that the public health, safety and

welfare is protected during the drilling and/or extraction process.

The City Clerk's office shall place the request for a variance on the agenda of the City Council for consideration at a public meeting. The applicant shall receive written notice of the date of the proposed hearing on the variance request. The City staff shall not be required to provide written notice of the variance request to any other individual or entity. On the date that the item is set for hearing, the City Council shall conduct a public hearing on the variance request giving any individual who desires to present information or evidence to the City Council on the appropriateness or inappropriateness of the variance, the opportunity to appear before the City Council and present such information. At the conclusion of the hearing, the City Council, by majority vote, may approve a variance to the provisions of this moratorium ordinance or may deny the request for variance. The City Council, in granting such variance and subsequent permit, may place such reasonable conditions and requirements on such permit to insure the public health, safety and welfare is protected.

SECTION 6

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of the ordinances of the City of Payette, Idaho, as amended, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such Ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such Ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7

If any portion of this Ordinance should be found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of the Ordinance shall be applied to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8

This moratorium shall remain in full force and effect upon its passage and for a period not to exceed 180 days, unless terminated prior to that time by action of the City Council.

SECTION 9

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by the laws of the State of Idaho.

SECTION 10

Any violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable by fine and/or imprisonment up to but not exceeding the maximum penalties set forth in Idaho Code § 50-302, as amended. Each day during which a violation takes place or is allowed to continue shall constitute a separate violation of this chapter.


