

ORDINANCE NO. 513

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 34 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, 1920, TO PROVIDE FOR INSPECTION OF FIRE HAZARDS BY THE MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND FIXING THE COMPENSATION THEREFOR; AMENDING SECTION 295 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, 1920, RELATING TO REFILLING OF TRENCHES AFTER LAYING SEWER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE:

Section 1. That Section 34 of the General Ordinances of the City of Payette, 1920, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 34. The Chief of the Fire Department may from time to time as requested by the Mayor and Council designate members of the Fire Department to make inspections of the City of Payette for fire hazards. Such persons shall report their findings to the Mayor and Council. The compensation of such persons for services for inspections shall be at such rate, as from time to time is designated by the Council, per hour and shall be allowed in the same manner as other claims against the city. Provided that the same rate for inspection services shall apply when inspections of chimneys, fireplaces and fire hazards are made under the provisions of Ordinances Nos. 507 and 508.

Section 2. That Section 295 of the General Ordinances of the City of Payette, 1920, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 295. All trenches shall be refilled in a careful and workmanlike manner and tramped or puddled so as to replace as nearly as possible, all excavated material, and leave the surface in as good condition as before the commencement of work. Special care shall be observed with trenches within streets and alleys, and all surplus material must be removed when work is completed, and any refilling of trenches necessary to maintain the highway in a good condition for a period of one year shall be done by the drain layer.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE:

Section 1. That Section 34 of the General Ordinances of the City of Payette, 1920, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 34. The Chief of the Fire Department may from time to time as requested by the Mayor and Council designate members of the Fire Department to make inspections of the City of Payette for fire hazards. Such persons shall report their findings to the Mayor and City Council. The compensation of such persons for services for inspections shall be at such rate, as from time to time is designated by the Council, per hour and shall be allowed in the same manner as other claims against the city. Special care shall be observed with trenches within streets and alleys, and all surplus material must be removed when work is completed, and any refilling of trenches necessary to maintain the high way in a good condition for a period of one year shall be done by the drain layer.
