

ORDINANCE NO. 776

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING SECTION 2-1-2 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, TO PROVIDE FOR THE INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION TO A NUMBER OF TWELVE (12) MEMBERS; TO PROVIDE FOR A SIX YEAR TERM OF OFFICE FOR EACH MEMBER; TO ADD SECTION 2-1-10 TO CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE 2 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE TO PROVIDE FOR STANDING COMMITTEES ON THE PLANNING COMMISSION.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 2-1-2: QUALIFICATIONS; TERM OF OFFICE:

Said Planning Commission shall consist of the Mayor and attorney, ex-officio, and ~~seven-(7)~~ ten (10) other members to be appointed by the Mayor, and confirmed by the City Council; at least one (1) of whom the members shall be a qualified engineer. All members shall be residents and taxpayers of the City, except that one (1) member may be a non-resident taxpayer appointed from without the City Limits. ~~At the first meeting of the planning commission the seven-(7) appointed members shall choose their term of office by allotment as follows: two-(2) for two-(2) years, two-(2) for four-(4) years, three-(3) for six-(6) years and shall immediately thereafter notify the Mayor and Council of such allotment. Thereafter their successors,~~ All appointed members of the Planning Commission, shall be appointed for and shall hold office for a term of six (6) years. In the event of the death, resignation or any vacancy in said Commission, the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to fill such vacancy by appointment for the unexpired term of such member or members.

Section 2-1-10: STANDING COMMITTEE:

The Mayor shall have the power to provide for various standing committees composed of members of the Planning Commission, and he shall appoint from the Planning Commission the members of each committee; each standing committee shall have the duty and power to study the problems and conditions existing within its particular scope and field, and each standing committee shall submit its recommendations and suggestions relating to the problems and conditions existing within its particular scope and field to the Planning Commission.

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Independent Enterprise, a newspaper of general circulation in the City and County of Payette, Idaho.
