

ORDINANCE NO. 820

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING SECTIONS 17 AND 19 OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 3 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO TO PROVIDE FOR THE CHARGING OF EXPENSES FOR TURNING ON WATER AND FOR THE REFUND OF THE UTILITY FUND DEPOSIT.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, State of Idaho:

That Sections 17 and 19, of the Municipal Code of the City of Payette be hereby amended and repealed as follows:

3-3-17: CHARGES PAYABLE TO CLERK: ~~All~~ All charges will be due and payable at the office of the Clerk on the first day of each month, and any charges or rates not paid within ten (10) days from the time they are due and payable the water shall be shut off from the premises, and shall not be turned on again until such charges or rates are paid, together with the sum of ~~one-dollar-(\$1.00)~~ fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for a utility fund deposit, if said deposit has not previously been made, or the same has been refunded, in addition ~~for~~ to the expense of turning the water on again, as may be determined by the City Council.

3-3-19: UTILITY FUND DEPOSIT REQUIRED: From each owner, tenant or lessee of property, the Clerk shall, before the City water, sewer, refuse collection and other such monthly services are furnished, collect and receive a utility account deposit in the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00), which deposit shall be collected to secure the payment of all charges thereafter billed to the utility account for the premises occupied by that individual.

All such deposits shall be placed in a fund known as the "Utility account deposit fund." Upon termination of services for any cause, the amount of the balance of the utility account for such premises shall be transferred to the utility fund of the City and credited to the account, and the balance of the account, if any, shall, ~~upon application therefor~~, be refunded to the person making the deposit. If application for such refund has ~~can not been~~ be made within six (6) months because of the unknown whereabouts of the person making the deposit, the balance of the deposit shall be transferred to the utility fund of the City. In all cases where utility account deposits shall have been made by such tenant, the owner of the premises shall be relieved of all such charges to the extent of the deposit and the balance shall be collected as in other cases.

The utility fund deposit shall be refunded to the person making the deposit in the event all charges billed for a continuous period of one year to said person for water, sewer, refuse collection and other such monthly services have been paid within ten (10) days the said charges become due and payable during said one (1) year period.
