

3-3-19: UTILITY FUND DEPOSIT REQUIRED: From each owner, tenant or lessee of property, the Clerk shall, before the city water, sewer, refuse collection and other such monthly services are furnished, collected and received a utility account deposit in the sum of ~~fifteen-dollars-(\$15.00)~~ Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), which deposit shall be collected to secure the payment of all charges thereafter billed to the Utility Account for the premises occupied by that individual.


All such deposits shall be placed in a fund known as the "Utility Account Deposit Fund". Upon termination of services for any cause, the amount of the balance of the utility account for such premises shall be transferred to the utility fund of the City and credited to the account and the balance of the account, if any, shall be refunded to the person making the deposit. If such refund cannot be made within six (6) months because of the unknown whereabouts of the person making the deposit, the balance of the deposit shall be transferred to the utility fund of the City. In all cases where utility account deposits shall have been made by such tenant, the owner of the premises shall be relieved of all such charges to the extent of the deposit and the balance shall be collected as in other cases.

The utility fund deposit shall be refunded to the person making the deposit in the event all charges billed for a continuous period of one year to said person for water, sewer, refuse collection and other such monthly services have been paid within ten (10) days the said charges become due and payable during said one (1) year period.

3-3-20: CONNECTION FEE AND COSTS TO PROVIDE TAP PIPE AND SERVICES: A fee of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars shall be charged and collected by the Clerk for each and every connection to the City water mains and lines. ~~The sum of Twenty-five and no/100-(\$25.00)-Dollars shall be paid. In Addition to this connection fee there shall be a charge of Two Hundred and Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars for labor and services provided in putting in each tap pipe to connect the same with the curb box; a further and charge for the current cost of materials and the actual cost of repairing the street after the installation of the tap pipe. shall also be paid; such actual and current cost to be determined by the water superintendent.~~

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Independent Enterprise, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Payette, Idaho.
