

ORDINANCE No. 268

Introduced by W. Peterson

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 248, entitled An Ordinance to regulate the riding of Bicycles and Tricycles within the City of Payette, Idaho, and to provide for the violation thereof, and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 248 of the City of Payette, Idaho, be amended to read as follows:

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a bicycle or tricycle on any sidewalk, or the parking between the roadway and the sidewalk within said City of Payette; provided; that the Mayor shall have the power to, at his discretion, issue permits to cripples, messengers or newsboys when on duty in said City, to ride a bicycle on the sidewalks within said City, and that the Mayor shall have power to revoke any such permit so granted by him, when deemed advisable.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined on conviction thereof, the sum of not less than \$1.00, nor more than \$25.00, and the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. That said original Ordinance No. 248, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
