

ORDINANCE NO 290

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS ONE AND FIVE OF ORDINANCE NO.144 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE LICENCING AND REGULATING POOL ROOMS, CARD ROOMS, BILLIARD HALLS AND BOWLING ALLEYS, PROHIBITING MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS FROM PLAYING ANY OF THE GAMES OF POOL, CARDS, BILLIARD OR BOWLING, AND FROM FREQUENTING OR ENTERING ANY ROOM OR HALL WHERE THE GAMES OF POOL, CARDS, BILLIARDS OR BOWLING ARE PLAYED; PROVIDING FOR THE PUNISHMENT FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO.85 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO".

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho.

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No.144 of the City of Payette, Idaho, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. It shall be and is hereby made unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to run, operate, or maintain any room or place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, where the games of pool, cards, billiards or bowling are played by the public, or for any person, firm, association or corporation to permit or allow any of the games of pool, cards, billiards or bowling to be played in any such room, hall or other place, without having first procured a license from the City of Payette, Idaho

Section 2. Section 5 of Ordinance No.144 of the City of Payette, Idaho, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. It shall be and hereby is made unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one years to either engage in any game of pool, cards, billiards or bowling in any place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, where such games are played by the public, or to frequent, enter or remain in any such pool room or bowling alley or any place where such games are played by the public; or for any proprietor, or person who has charge of any such pool room, card room, billiard hall or bowling alley or any other place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, where such games are played by the public, to permit or allow any person under said age to frequent, enter or remain in any such place
