

ORDINANCE NO. 307 by

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 96 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE BURNING OF RUBBISH ON THE STREETS, ALLEYS OR LOTS WITHIN THE FIRE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, AND PROVIDING THE PUNISHMENT THEREFOR."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1.

That section two of ordinance 96 of the City of Payette, Idaho, passed and approved the 16th day of September, 1907, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Any person who shall kindle any fire upon any street, alley or lot within the said fire limits, unless the same be enclosed as is provided in section 1 of ordinance No. 96 of the City of Payette, Idaho, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, together with costs of prosecution, or imprisoned in the city jail not exceeding fifty days.

Section 2.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official newspaper of the City of Payette, Idaho.
