

ORDINANCE NO. 316 by Musgrove

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING "SECTIONS 1 and 2" OF ORDINANCE NO. 183 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING CONNECTIONS WITH SEWERS IN ANY SEWER DISTRICT OF THE CITY AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1.

That section one of ordinance No. 183 of the City of Payette Idaho, entitled "An ordinance requiring connections with sewers in any sewer district of the City and providing a penalty for the violation thereof", passed and approved the 27th day of February, 1911, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Every vault or privy in upon or belonging to any residence, factory, mill, warehouse, outhouse, store, office or other building, together with all drainage from bathtubs, sinks or basins therein located on any lot, or lots, pieces or parcels of land adjoining or abutting upon or within 150 feet from any street or alley or other place through which there is a public or private or lateral district sewer connected with the sanitary sewer of said City, shall be connected by the owner or owners of the said property, or his or their agent or other person having charge of or receiving the rents of or being tenants of the same, with such public or private or lateral district sewer, when required to do so, by order of the City Council and notice from the City Clerk, which order and notice shall be served upon the owner or owners of said property by the Chief of Police or any policeman of the city, and if said owner or owners or his or their agent or any other person having charge of the said property, who shall have been served with said order and notice, shall fail, neglect or refuse within the time indicated in such order and notice to comply with the requirements of such order, he shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for any one offense, recoverable with costs, and in default of payment thereof he shall be confined in the City jail and may be compelled to work at hard labor upon the streets of said city or elsewhere for the benefit of the said city, one day for each two dollars of such fine and costs.

Each days failure to comply with the requirements of said order and notice, after the time stated and indicated in such order and notice, shall be deemed a separate offense and for each separate offense such person shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, recoverable with costs and in default of payment thereof he shall be confined in the City Jail and may be compelled to work at hard labor upon the streets of said city or elsewhere for the benefit of the said City, one day for each two dollars of such fine and costs.

Section 2.

That section two of ordinance No. 183 of the City of Payette, Idaho, entitled, "An ordinance requiring connections with sewers in any sewer district of the City and providing a penalty for the violation thereof", passed and approved the 27th day of February, 1911, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. All vaults, privies, cess-pools, bath tubs, sinks and basins within any sewer district of the City of Payette, Idaho, which are not properly connected with the sewer to the satisfaction of the sewer inspector are hereby condemned and the further use of such vault, toilet, privy, bathtub, sink or basin is hereby made a misdemeanor. The use of any means or method of flushing any vault, toilet, privy or cess-pool other than by the use of properly connected city water is hereby prohibited; and the use of any other means is hereby made a misdemeanor.

Any person violating the provisions of this section shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, recoverable with costs and in default of payment thereof he shall be confined in the city jail and be compelled to work at hard labor upon the streets of said city or elsewhere for the benefit of the said city, one day for each two dollars of such fine and costs.

Section 3.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the official newspaper of the City of Payette, Idaho.
