

ORDINANCE NO 357 BY COPELAND

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO COUNTY DOUGHBOY MEMORIAL COMMISSION OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, A LICENSE TO ERECT AND PERMANENTLY MAINTAIN A " DOUGHBOY MEMORIAL " MONUMENT AT THE INTERSECTION OF EIGHT STREET AND CENTER AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, AND LIMITING THE LIABILITY OF THE SAID CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, FOR THE COST OF ERECTING AND MAINTAINING SAID MONUMENT AS WELL AS ALL DAMAGES WHICH MAY BE OCCASIONED THEREBY.

BE/ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
PAYETTE, STATE OF IDAHO:

Section 1. That whereas the County Doughboy Memorial Commission of Payette, Idaho, has made application for a permanent license to erect and maintain a fitting memorial to the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines, of the United States of America and her Allies, who lost their lives in the late war with Germany and her allies, within the City of Payette, Idaho; and it appearing to be entirely meet and proper that such a memorial should be erected and maintained, the said County Doughboy Memorial Commission of Payette, Idaho, is hereby granted a permanent license to erect and maintain at the center of the intersection of Eight Street and Center Avenue, in the City of Payette, Idaho, a " Doughboy Memorial ".

Section 2. Said memorial to<sup>be</sup> erected in accordance with the specifications now on file in the office of the City Clerk, and not to exceed seven feet square on the base and not to exceed ~~eight~~<sup>fifteen</sup> ~~feet~~<sup>sixteen</sup> feet in height. Said memorial to be erected in such manner as will not endanger the public health or safety of the residents of the City of Payette, or any other person.

Section 3. The County Doughboy Memorial Commission of Payette, Idaho, in accepting the license herein granted assumes all liability for the cost of erecting and maintaining such memorial, as well as, all damages which may be occasioned thereby to the city of Payette or any person, firm or corporation.

Section 4. In no event shall the City of Payette, Idaho, be liable for the cost of erecting or maintaining said memorial, nor for any damages which may be occasioned thereby. Neither shall said city be required to defend the right of the said County Doughboy Memorial Commission to erect or maintain said memorial, should such right be questioned or attacked in any way whatever.
