

Ordinance No. 367 By Johnston

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARADES, REQUIRING A PERMIT THEREFOR AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH PERMIT; ALSO REGULATING THE SALE AND USE OF FIREWORKS OF ALL KINDS; ALSO PROHIBITING CERTAIN KINDS OF PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1. No person or persons, firm or corporation shall parade, march or take part in any parade, march or performance of like nature and character, within the limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, without first having obtained the permission of the mayor of said city as provided in this section.

Any person or persons, firm or corporation desiring to parade, march, or take part in any performance of like nature and character on any of the streets of the City of Payette, Idaho, as provided in this section, shall make application to the mayor of said city, setting forth the kind and nature of such parade, and the number of persons, vehicles and animals that they desire to take part in said parade, march or performance of like nature and character, and thereupon the mayor of the City of Payette, Idaho, may, if in his judgment it is proper so to do, authorize and permit such parade, march or performance of like nature and kind and character and designate the street or streets in said city which said person persons, firm or corporation shall be allowed to use for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned.

No person or persons, firm or corporation, shall parade or march or take part in a parade, march or any performance of like nature and character within the limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, upon any other street or streets than those designated by the mayor of said city.

No person, persons, firm or corporation shall use or display in any such parade, march or performance of like nature and character any red flags, emblems or banners of like kind, nor any lighted or burning cross, circle or other symbol, figure or character or emblem.

No person, persons, firm or corporation shall be given nor have the permission and right hereinabove provided for to march or parade or take part in any parade, march or any performance of like nature and character while masked or hooded in such a manner as to ~~render the identity~~ prevent the immediate identity of the person or person so taking part in such parade, march or other performance.

Nothing in the preceding five paragraphs shall be construed to apply to any funeral procession.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale any fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, without first securing a permit from the mayor of said city so to do. Applications for permit must be made in duplicate and must state:

- (a) The name of the person or persons by whom the permit is desired.
- (b) The location of the premises in which the goods are to be stored or sold.
- (c) The kind and amount of fireworks to be sold or stored.

Upon such an application being made the mayor shall cause the Chief of the fire department to make an inspection of the premises, and to report his approval or disapproval thereof. If the application be approved the mayor may issue such permit, if the application be disapproved such application shall be by the mayor referred to the city council for disposition.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to fire or discharge any fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, except upon such days and dates and between such hours as the mayor and council of said city may from time to time prescribe, fix and designate.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful to sell or offer to sell or to discharge or fire any of the following kinds of fireworks, within the City of Payette, Idaho, to-wit:

Firecrackers containing chlorate of potash or other high explosives, firecrackers larger than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches in length or more than one-fourth inch in diameter, marbles coated with any explosive mixture, fireworks containing picric acid or picrates, colored fire or other fireworks containing sulphur and chlorate of potash in admixture; pistols, canes, cannons or other appliances using blank cartridges or using caps containing chlorate of potash mixture, bombardments or mandarins made of chlorate of potash mixture.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to burn or light, or to cause to be burned or lighted any symbol, figure or character, (such as a cross or circle and the like) or to make or cause to be made any public demonstration by means of any bomb, rocket, flash powder or any other means calculated to make or cause a loud sound or noise or calculated to make or cause a bright or spectacular light.

Section 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. And upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
