ORDINANCE NO. 85 Day Patch

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO MINORS ENGAGING IN THE GAMES OF POOL, BILLIARDS OR CARDS, AND FREQUENTING PLACES WHERE SUCH GAMES ARE PLAYED, AND PROVIDING THE PUNISHMENT THEREFOR.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen (18) years, to either engage in any game of pool, billiards or cards in any place where such games are played by the public for a rent or hire, or to frequent or remain in any such pool room, billiard hall or card room, or any place where such games are played by the public, or for any proprietor or person who has charge of any pool room, billiard hall, card room or place where such games are played by the public, to permit or allow any child under said age to frequent their place or places or remain in same.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined any sum not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars, or be imprisoned in the City Jail not exceeding thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. All ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
