ORDINANCE NO. 86 by Patch

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CHILDREN FROM RUNNING ABOUT THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND VACANT LOTS AT NIGHT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 16 years to go abroad upon or wander about the streets and alleys, or public grounds, or upon any of the unoccupied lots of the City of Payette, after the hour of nine o'clock at night during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September, or the hour of eight o'clock at night during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March, unless such person be accompanied by his or her parent or guardian, or shall have necessary business upon such street or other place.

Section 2. Any child violating Section 1 of this Ordinance and any person who has the care or custody of such child, who shall permit or allow such child under his or her care, custody or control to violate said Section, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding ~~\$25.00~~ twenty five (25) dollars, provided that for a first offense the police magistrate, may in his discretion, remit said fine.

Section 3. It is hereby made the duty of the city marshall and special policemen to apprehend all children found violating Section ^I of this Ordinance, and take them to their parents or custodian, if the same can be found in said city. Each officer shall keep a record of each child so apprehended, stating the name thereof, the name of the parents or custodian, and what disposition was made of each child, and report the same at the next meeting of the Council following such arrest.
