

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1143

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE IDAHO, AMENDING SECTION 16.12.080, BY CREATING NEW STANDARDS FOR STREET LIGHTING; SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; ESTABLISHING SEVERABILITY; ESTABLISHING A REPEALER; ESTABLISHING A PENALTY;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO;

Section 1. Section 16.12.080 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 16.12.080: A. As a part of any development or any subdividing, the purchase and installation of street lights and poles shall be the responsibility of the developer. ~~The street-lights-and-poles-shall-conform-to-City-standards-and-Idaho Power-Company-standards.~~ The positioning and placement of the lights shall be determined by Idaho Power Company and shall be subject to the approval of the City. The cost of placement of all lights and poles shall be the developer's responsibility and shall be installed and operational before acceptance of these streets by the City.

B. Street light poles shall be of a metal manufacture and shall meet the requirements of ASTM Standard Specifications for structural supports for highway signs, luminaries, and traffic signals as published in 1985 by the American Society for Testing and Materials for loading, wind shear and strength, utilizing 100 Watt High Pressure Sodium (H.P.S.), General Electric Cobra Heads and lamps. The mounting height shall be 25 feet with a minimum burial depth of 5 feet. The pole length shall be a minimum of 30 feet. All steel or aluminum seamless poles shall be used and shall meet or exceed the specifications for both pole and accompanying concrete, steel reinforced base as specified in standard drawing number 1. There shall be a six foot (6') mast arm and cobra type fixture for residential street intersections. The developer shall unconditionally guarantee and warrant all materials and labor for a period of one year after its acceptance by the City. The developer shall indemnify and hold the City harmless for any damages resulting from any defects in workmanship or materials for a period of one year after the date the city accepts the street lamps.

Section 2. All ordinances which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed but only insofar as the conflict exists.

Section 3. If any portion of this Ordinance should be found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect and shall constitute Ordinance 1143.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.
