

ORDINANCE NO. 419

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES, FIXING A FEE THEREFOR, PROVIDING FOR THE DISPLAY OF NUMBER PLATES THEREON, PROVIDING FOR HEAD-LIGHTS AND REFLECTORS, PROVIDING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, PROHIBITING MORE THAN ONE RIDER AND BICYCLE RACES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO:

Section 1.--It shall be unlawful for any person to ride, operate, allow or permit any bicycle to stand on the streets or alley's of the City of Payette, unless such bicycle has been registered with the City Clerk of the City of Payette, and without displaying the proper registered numbered plate thereon, as hereinafter provided.

Section 2.--Before the 1st day of January of each year, every bicycle in the City of Payette, Idaho, must be registered with the City Clerk of said City, showing the proper name and address of the owner, and the make, serial number and general description of bicycle and the name of the person or dealer from whom such bicycle was purchased.

Section 3.--At the time of registration a number plate shall be assigned to said bicycle, which number plate must be attached to the rear end of said bicycle in plain view. Said number plate shall be so displayed during the current registration year. Any number plate issued or used the previous year will be deemed unlawful after the 1st day of January each year.

Section 4.--Every bicycle owner shall pay a fee of twenty-five cents for each bicycle registered and to which a number plate is issued. In case of a sale or transfer of a bicycle from one individual to another the registration of such bicycle together with the number plate originally assigned thereto shall be transferred to the new purchaser or transferee, and the number plate originally assigned to such bicycle must remain attached thereto until the end of the current registration year. The City Clerk shall be responsible under his official bond for all moneys collected under and pursuant to this ordinance and shall account to and deliver all such moneys in his possession to the Treasurer of the City of Payette, on the first day of each and every month.

Section 5.--Every person riding a bicycle upon highway, street or alley within the City of Payette shall be subject to all the rules and regulations applicable to the driver of any vehicle, except those provisions which by their very nature can have no application.

Section 6.--No person shall ride a bicycle upon the streets, alleys or public places of the City of Payette during the nighttime, without having such bicycle equipped with a headlight lighted and attached to the front thereof and a reflector attached to the rear thereof.

Section 7.--Two or more riders on the same bicycle is prohibited at all times. No one, while riding a bicycle within corporate limits of the City of Payette, shall hold on to any other vehicle.


Section 8.--No bicycle shall be sold or registered unless it shall have embossed, cut or impressed on some portion thereof a serial or manufacturers number. Any person who has in his possession a bicycle from which the serial or manufacturers number has been removed or defaced shall present such bicycle to the Chief of Police who after investigation shall issue numbers to the proper owner to be placed on such bicycle and registered as a serial number before license plate shall be issued.

Section 9.--Bicycle Races--It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to run or engage in, or cause to be run or engaged in, any bicycle race within the corporate limits of the City of Payette provided that road races may be run and engaged in under the supervision and direction of the Chief of Police, who is hereby given authority to designate the streets that may be traversed in such road races.

Section 10.--Any person who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offense, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars; Provided that for a violation of any provision of this Ordinance the Police Judge of the City of Payette may prohibit the operation upon the streets and alleys of the City of Payette of the bicycle used in such violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance for a period of not to exceed thirty days.

Section 11.--This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
