

ORDINANCE NO. 716

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 1-10-1 THROUGH 1-10-6 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE RELATING TO ELECTIONS TO PROVIDE THAT THE WARDS BE CHANGED TO PRECINCTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO:

Section 1. That Sections 1-10-1 through 1-10-6 of the municipal Code of the City of Payette be, and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION:

- 1-10-1: Appointment of Election Officers
- 1-10-2: Term of Office
- 1-10-3: Notice of Appointment
- 1-10-4: Vacancies
- 1-10-5: Polling Places Designated; Supplies
- 1-10-6: Compensation of Judges and Clerks

1-10-1: APPOINTMENT OF ELECTION OFFICERS: The Council shall at its regular meeting in August, prior to each biennial election, appoint five (5) capable and discreet persons, possessing the qualifications of electors, in each precinct as election officers. Three (3) of such persons shall be designated as judges of election and two (2) of such persons as clerks of election (Ord. 604; 4-1-57)

1-10-2: TERM OF OFFICE: Such officials shall hold office for the period of two (2) years and shall be officials of all elections, both general and special, during that period.

1-10-3: NOTICE OF APPOINTMENT: The Clerk shall give such appointee to give notice of his acceptance or declination of his appointment to the Clerk within ten (10) days thereafter.

1-10-4: VACANCIES: Any vacancies arising in the office of election officials shall be filled by the Council at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose. If such vacancy does not become apparent until the time of the opening of the polls, the qualified electors present may fill such vacancies from any electors present.

1-10-5: POLLING PLACES DESIGNATED; SUPPLIES: The Council shall designate suitable polling places in each precinct and cause the same to be provided with suitable voting compartments, supplies official stamps, ballot boxes and such other supplies as County

Commissioners are required to provide for State elections. (Ord. 496; 5-6-46)

1-10-6: COMPENSATION OF JUDGES AND CLERKS: The compensation of Judges and Clerks of election shall be eight dollars (\$8.00) per day, which shall cover the period from the opening of the polls until the polls close, together with the additional sum of one dollar (\$1.00) for each hour of time after the polls close until work is completed.
