

ORDINANCE NO. 934

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OPEN CONTAINERS OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR ON PUBLIC WAYS.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho, that Title 5 of the Municipal Code of the City of Payette, Idaho, be amended by the addition of Chapter 5.10 as follows:

5.10.010 Definition. As used in this ordinance, the following term has the following meaning:

Alcoholic liquor: Any spirits, wine, beer, ale or other liquid containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume, which is fit for beverage purposes or intended for beverage purposes.

5.10.020 Consumption. No person shall consume any alcoholic liquor while in or upon public streets, alleys, sidewalks, parking lots, or other public ways.

5.10.030 Open container. No person shall be in possession of any glass, can or open container containing alcoholic liquor on any thoroughfare, street, sidewalk, alleys, parking lots or any other public way.


5.10.040 Licensee not to permit removal of open container. No person, firm or corporation licensed to sell alcoholic liquor, or his employees or agents, shall permit any person to remove from such premises, any alcoholic liquor in any open container.

5.10.050 Open container in motor vehicles. No person shall have in his or her possession an open container containing alcoholic liquor within or on a motor vehicle, including motorcycles, while parked or standing on a public street or public parking lot in the city, or while such vehicle is in motion.


5.10.060 Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Independent Enterprise, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Payette, Idaho.
