

ORDINANCE NO. 149.

By Woodward.

An Ordinance Prohibiting the Sale of Impure, Contaminated or Diluted Milk or Cream and Making the Selling or Offering for Sale Thereof, a Misdemeanor and Providing Punishment Therefor and Other Purposes.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the city of Payette, Idaho.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any milk or cream in which has been placed any foreign substance of any character for the purpose of preserving the same or of diluting the same, or of coloring the same, or of thickening the same, or for any other purpose, or to sell or offer for sale any milk which shall contain less than 12 per cent of total solids, or to sell or to offer for sale any milk which shall contain less than 3 1-2 of butter fat, or to sell or offer for sale any cream containing less than 18 per cent of butter fat.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any skimmed or separated milk or thin cream, from which has been removed any butter fat or other part of such milk or cream unless the seller thereof causes the same to be labelled according to the true character thereof, by delivering it in a glass jar or bottle in which the words "skimmed milk," "separated milk," or "thin cream," as the case may be, are blown in the bottle and the letters are not less than a half inch long, so that the purchaser may know the true condition thereof at the time of such purchase.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale, within the city of Payette any milk or cream unless the cows from which said milk or cream is obtained, and all enclosures, utensils and processes shall be kept and conducted in substantial requirement with the following conditions: The cows shall be healthy cows, free from disease of any character, and shall be fed on wholesome feed and shall not be allowed to water from stagnant pools, and no milk shall be sold from any cow having any disease, or having any abscess or suppurating cores or any inflamed condition of the udder, and all cows having any such disease, sore or inflammation shall be separated from the dairy herd until cured. All stables shall be kept dry and free from drainage and in a good, clean sanitary condition, well ventilated, and shall be thoroughly whitewashed at least once each six months and no manure shall be located, kept or allowed to stand within one hundred feet of such stable. All milking utensils or utensils used for the purpose of containing milk, or with which the milk shall in any manner come in contact

shall be sterilized with boiling water at least once a day. Dairymen shall use all reasonable care to keep the cows clean and free from dirt, and to prevent any dirt, filth or contamination of any character from entering the milk. The milk shall be thoroughly strained and shall be kept in a milk house or other place which is thoroughly ventilated and in a good, clean sanitary condition, and there shall be no more manure deposited or allowed to stand within one hundred feet of such milk house or other place of storing milk.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation engaged in selling or offering for sale in the city of Payette milk or cream, to leave any bottle or other utensil at any dwelling house or other place under quarantine under the ordinances of the city of Payette on account of any contagious disease.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale any milk within the city of Payette at any time when any member of his family or household, or any employee or other person engaged in any manner in handling or caring for such milk, or any member of the household of such employee or other person so handling such milk, shall have any contagious or infectious disease, unless such person shall first obtain a permit from the city Physician so to do.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any milk or cream from any cow unless such cow has been tested with tuberculin within the last 12 months and found to be free from tuberculosis, according to such test and ear-tagged by the Veterinarian making the test. It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person but the Veterinarian making the test to change such ear tag in any way. The test shall be performed by a graduate Veterinarian, designated by the Board of Health of the city of Payette nor shall any person, firm or corporation sell or offer for sale any milk or cream from any cow without re-testing same and finding her free from tuberculosis, which

has been allowed to run in a pasture or corral or stand in a barn with any animal which has been so tested and by which test has been found to be tubercular.

Section 7. All expenses necessary to the testing of cows shall be borne by the owner, unless the Board of Health shall see fit to ask a State or Federal Veterinarian to make the test once a year. All cows not tested at the time the State or Federal Veterinarian is ready to test, and addition to the herd must be tested at the owner's expense, by the Veterinarian designated.

Section 8. Any member of the Board of Health or the Veterinarian designated may inspect the premises where the cows are kept or where the dairyman buys milk or the vehicle used in the transportation or delivery of milk and see that they are kept clean and in good condition. All drivers shall use due care in the handling of milk to keep the same free from dust, dirt or other contamination and to keep their own person and clothing in a cleanly condition.

Section 9. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any person selling or furnishing milk or cream from a single cow to not more than three families but such cow must be tested for tuberculosis and tagged at least once a year, as herein provided, and the premises where such cow is kept, inspected and kept clean and in good sanitary condition and are subject to inspection by any member of the Board of Health, or by the Veterinarian designated.

Section 10. A violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than ten days nor more than fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and each sale or offer for sale shall be under the provisions of this ordinance, deemed a separate offense.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE SALE OF IMPURE, CONTAMINATED OR DILUTED MILK OR CREAM AND MAKING THE SELLING OR OFFERING FOR SALE THEREOF, A MISDEMEANOR AND PROVIDING PUNISHMENT THEREFOR AND OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it ordained (By Woodward) by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho.
The People of the City of Payette do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any milk or cream in which has been placed any foreign substance of any character for the purpose of preserving the same or of diluting the same, or of coloring the same, or of thickening the same, or for any other purpose, or to sell or offer for sale any milk which shall contain less than 12% of total solids, or to sell or offer for sale any milk which shall contain less than 3 1/2% of butter fat, or to sell or offer for sale any cream containing less than 18% of butter fat.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any skimmed or separated milk or thin cream, from which has been removed any butter fat or other part of such milk or cream unless the seller thereof causes the same to be labelled according to the true character thereof, by delivering it in a glass jar or bottle in which the words "skimmed milk", "separated milk", or "thin cream", as the case may be, are blown in the bottle and the letters are not less than a half inch long, so that the purchaser may know the true condition thereof at the time of such purchase.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale, within the city of Payette any milk or cream unless the cows from which said milk or cream is obtained, and all enclosures, utensils and processes shall be kept and conducted in substantial requirement with the following conditions: The cows shall be healthy cows, free from disease of any character, and shall be fed on wholesome feed and shall not be allowed to water from stagnant pools, and no milk shall be sold from any cow having any disease, or having any abscess or suppurating cores or any inflamed condition of the udder, and all cows having any such disease, sore or inflammation shall be separated from the dairy herd until cured. shall be located, kept or allowed to stand within one hundred feet of such stable. All milking utensils or utensils used for the purpose of containing milk, or with which the milk shall in any manner come in contact shall be sterilized with boiling water at least once a day. Dairymen shall use all reasonable care ~~to~~ to keep the cows clean and free from dirt, and to prevent any dirt, filth or contamination of any character from entering the milk. The milk shall be thoroughly strained and shall be kept in a milk house or other place which is thoroughly ventilated and in a good, clean sanitary condition, and there shall be no manure deposited or allowed to stand within one hundred feet of such milk house or other place of storing milk.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation engaged in selling or offering for sale in the city of Payette milk or cream, to leave any bottle or other utensil at any dwelling house or other place under quarantine under the ordinances of the city of Payette on account of any contagious disease.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale any milk within the city of Payette at any time when any member of his family or household, or any employee or other person engaged in any manner in handling or caring for such milk, or any member of the household of such employee or other person so handling such milk, shall have any contagious or infectious disease, unless such person shall first obtain a permit from the City Physician so to do.

SECTION 6. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale within the city of Payette any milk or cream from any cow unless such cow has been tested with tuberculin within the last 12 months and found to be free from tuberculosis, according to such test and ear-tagged by the Veterinarian making the test. It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person but the Veterinarian making the test to change such ear tag in any way. The test shall be performed by a graduate Veterinarian, designated by the Board of Health of the city of Payette nor shall any person, firm or corporation sell or offer for sale any milk or cream from any cow without re-testing same and finding her free from tuberculosis, which has been allowed to run in a pasture or corral or stand in a barn with any animal which has been so tested and by which test has been found to be tubercular.

SECTION 7. All expenses necessary to the testing of cows shall be born by the owner, unless the Board of Health shall see fit to ask a State or Federal Veterinarian to make the test once a year. All cows not tested at the time the State or Federal Veterinarian is ready to test, and additions to the herd must be tested at the owner's expense, by the Veterinarian designated.

SECTION 8. Any member of the Board of Health or the Veterinarian designated may inspect the premises where the cows are kept or where the dairyman buys milk or the vehicle used in the transportation or delivery of milk and see that they are kept clean and in good condition. All drivers shall use due care in the handling of milk to keep the same free from dust, dirt or other contamination and to keep their own person and clothing in a cleanly condition.

SECTION 9. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any person selling or furnishing milk or cream from a single cow to not more than three families but such cow must be tested for tuberculosis and tagged at least once a year, as herein provided, and the premises where such cow is kept, inspected and kept clean and in good sanitary condition and are subject to inspection by any member of the Board of Health, or by the Veterinarian designated.

SECTION 10. A violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than ten days nor more than fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and each sale or offer for sale shall be under the provisions of this ordinance, deemed a separate offense.
