

An Ordinance Providing for the Holding of a Special Election in the City of Payette, County of Canyon, State of Idaho, for the Purpose of Submitting to the Qualified Electors Who are Tax Payers Thereof the Questions of the Issuance of Municipal Coupon Bonds of Said City in the Total Amount of Thirty-four Thousand Dollars (\$34,000.00), for the Following Purposes to-wit: Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00), to Provide the Funds Necessary to Pay the Costs Assessed Against the City of Payette, for the Expenses of All Improvements in the Spaces Formed by the Junction of All Streets and All Necessary Street and Alley Crossings, For the Purchase of All Materials Necessary for the Construction and Maintenance of a Sewer System in "Local Sewerage Improvement District No. 1" of the City of Payette, Idaho: Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) to Provide the Funds Necessary to Pay the Costs of Extending the Water Mains and the Water System of the Said City of Payette and for Purchasing a Power Site for Pumping Purposes and the Power Necessary for Such Pumping: Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to Provide for the Funding, Purchase and Redeeming Certain Created, Existing and Outstanding Indebtedness of the City of Payette Amounting to the Sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) Due and Payable Out of the Road Fund, General Fund, Salary Fund and Water Works Fund of the Said City; and to Provide for the Collection of an Annual Tax Upon All the Taxable Property within the City of Payette, Idaho, Sufficient to Pay the interest on Such Bonds As it Falls Due and to Create and Constitute a Sinking Fund for the Payment of the Principal Thereof Within Twenty Years From the Time of the Issuance of the Same As They Become Due.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1. That a special election of the qualified electors, who are tax payers thereof, of the City of Payette, County of Canyon, State of Idaho, shall be held therein on the 29th day of November, 1909, for the purpose of submitting to the said electors the question of the issuance of, by said City, Municipal Coupon Bonds in denominations of \$100, \$500 and \$1000 each, payable within twenty years from the date of the issuance, redeemable at the pleasure of the said City at any time after ten years, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed six per centum per annum, interest payable semi-annually, in an amount in the aggregate not to exceed the sum of \$34,000.00 and to provide for the levy and collection of an annual tax upon all the taxable property in the City of Payette sufficient to pay the interest upon said bonds as it falls due and to create and constitute a sinking fund for the payment at any time after ten years of the principal of said bonds as they become due, for the following described purposes, to-wit:

First. Municipal coupon bonds to the amount of \$12,000.00 to be designated as "Sewer Bonds" to provide the funds necessary to pay the cost assessed against the City of Payette, in Ordinance No. 154 of said City, for the expenses of all improvements in the spaces formed by the junction of all streets, and all necessary street and alley crossings, for the purchase of the materials for said improvements and for the construction and maintenance of a complete sewer system in "Local Sewerage Improvement District No. 1" of the City of Payette, the boundaries of which are minutely set forth in Ordinance No. 154 of said City which is hereby referred to and made a part hereof.

Second. Municipal Coupon Bond to be known as "Water Works Extension Bonds" to the amount of \$12,000.00 to provide the funds necessary to pay the cost and expenses of extending the water mains and water works system to parts of the City not yet supplied with city water and to purchase a power site and location for a power house and water power rights for the purpose of pumping water or any other power and machinery that may be found necessary; for the purchase of materials for said work and improvements and the construction of the same.

Third. Municipal Coupon Bonds to be known as "Funding Bonds" to the amount of \$10,000 to provide for the funding, purchase and redeeming of the following created, existing, outstanding and unpaid indebtedness of the City of Payette, to-wit:

Geo. W. Baker for salary, \$25; E. Coulter for salary, \$420; Wm. Noot for salary, \$50; A. Coulter, salary, \$1350; A. B. Covington, salary \$790; T. J. Barnes, salary, \$60; H. Feldscher, salary, \$75; F. H. Lyon, salary, \$25; J. L. Henshaw, salary \$135; Martin Luther, salary \$80; J. A. Laurer, salary \$25; which sum is due and payable out of the Salary Fund; Payette Light and Power Company, for street lighting, \$1120.98; J. L. Henshaw, street sprinkling \$233.50; Venable & Kirk, printing \$90.20; Wm. Noot, professional services \$5; Richards & Haga, professional services \$25; Prestel & Sons, lumber and materials \$154.05; R. E. Haynes, services as police judge, \$30; A. Coulter, work \$1.75; F. H. Lyon, professional services \$40; Johnson & Son, draying and transfer work \$73; J. T. Johnson, street sprinkling \$91; T. J. Brown, printing \$152.50; Geo. W. Baker, incidental expenses and stamps \$32; J. McDonald, Registrar for election \$28.96; Ida Wells, registrar for election \$58; (Hattie Ackerman, Registrar for election \$52; Coulter Bros. transfer and draying \$37.75; Independent School District No. 32, one half of all liquor license and fine \$783.62; Idaho Implement Co, supplies \$105; John Alden materials and cement tiling \$34.60; C. P. Lattig, surveying \$51.55; which sum is due and payable out of the General Fund; Van Etten & Co., for draying and transfer work \$56.97; Prestel & Sons, lumber and materials \$47.43; H. A. Edwards, blacksmith work \$4.25; J.

Alden, cement tiling and materials \$140.14; E. Coulter, work \$18.00; Coulter Bros., dray and transfer \$80.10; Payette Land Company, work \$27.00; D. Looney, work and materials \$52.50; J. T. Johnson, street sprinkling \$171.50; which sum is due and payable out of the road fund; T. J. Barnes, superintendent of water works, \$1020; W. A. Coughanour, work on water works and materials \$130.86; Prestel & Sons, materials, \$15.12; I. Barry, freight on supplies and materials \$106.50; C. H. Barnes, work on water works \$65.47; Johnson & Son, hauling supplies and materials \$32.66; Standard Oil Co. oils and gasoline \$105.22; H. C. Jensen, work as machinist \$42; Crane & Co., water meters and supplies \$324.91; J. T. Johnson, work \$71.75; T. & K. Milling Co., rental for pumping stations and gasoline \$50.26; Fairbanks-Morse Co., supplies \$4.03; W. Miller Co., supplies \$103.20; which sum is due and payable out of the water works fund, making a total amount due and outstanding against said City of Payette of approximating \$10,000 all of which is due and payable out of the different funds of said City hereinbefore mentioned, in which funds there are no moneys with which to pay said indebtedness.

Said bonds or any of them, if authorized to be issued by the vote of the qualified electors, who are tax payers of said City, shall be payable 20 years from the date of issue, but shall be redeemable at the pleasure of the said City of Payette at any time after the expiration of ten years from the date of said issuance, and each bond shall be redeemed in the order it is numbered. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed 6 per centum per annum, interest payable semi-annually, and shall in all respects comply in form and issuance with the provisions of Section 2315 of the Idaho Revised Codes, as amended by the Session Laws of Idaho, 1909, at page 174 and Sections 2316 to 2371 inclusive of the Idaho Revised Codes.

Section 2. That in order to provide for the payment of the interest on such of said bonds as are authorized to be issued at the election herein provided for and to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof at maturity, a direct tax, in addition to all other City taxes, shall be levied and collected annually on all of the taxable property within the City of Payette, sufficient to meet the interest on all of such bonds as may be issued and outstanding from time to time, promptly as the same matures and also sufficient to establish and maintain a sinking fund which shall be sufficient to pay all bonds called in after the expiration of ten years and before the maturity thereof and also to promptly meet the payment of the principal of all bonds outstanding at their maturity.

Section 3. At least 30 days notice of the time of holding said special election is hereby directed to be given by publication in the Payette Enterprise, the official newspaper of the said City of Payette, and said election shall be conducted in accordance

with the ordinances of the said City and the laws of the State of Idaho, in such cases made and provided.

Section 4. That the voting at said election shall be by ballot and the ballots shall be so prepared as to permit the electors to express their desire on the issue of each one of the three classes of bonds separately. Such ballots shall be as follows, to-wit:

**First Proposition. \$12,000.00
Sewer Bonds.**

In favor of the issuing of bonds to the amount of \$12,000.00 to provide the funds necessary to pay the cost assessed against the City of Payette in Ordinance No. 154 of said City, for the expenses of all improvements in spaces formed by the junction

tion of all streets and all necessary street and alley crossings, for the purchase of materials necessary and for the construction and maintenance of a complete and necessary sewerage system in "Local Sewerage Improvement District No. 1" of the City of Payette.

Against issuing bonds to the amount of \$12,000.00 to provide the necessary funds to pay the cost assessed against the City of Payette as provided in Ordinance No. 154 of said City, for the expenses of all improvements in spaces formed by the junction of all streets and all necessary street and alley crossings, for the purchase of all materials necessary and for the construction and maintenance of a complete sewerage system in "Local Sewerage Improvement District No. 1" of the said City of Payette.

**Second Proposition. \$12,000.00
Water Works Extension Bonds.**

In favor of issuing bonds to the amount of \$12,000.00 to provide the necessary funds to pay the costs of extending the water mains and the water system of the said City of Payette and for purchasing a power site for pumping purposes and the power necessary for such pumping, and all necessary supplies and machinery and the putting in and maintenance of the said water system as extended.

Against Issuing Bonds to the amount of \$12,000.00 to provide the necessary funds to pay the costs of extending the water mains and the water system of the said City of Payette and for purchasing a power site for pumping purposes and the power necessary for such pumping, and all necessary supplies and machinery and the putting in and maintenance of the said water system as extended.

**Third Proposition. \$10,000.00
Funding Bonds.**

In favor of issuing bonds to the amount of \$10,000.00 to provide the funds necessary for the funding, purchase and redeeming those certain created, existing and outstanding indebtedness of the City of Payette amounting to the sum of \$10,000.00 as set forth in Ordinance No. 155, and which is due and payable out of the General Fund, Road Fund Salary Fund and Water Works Fund of the said City.

Against issuing bonds to the amount of \$10,000.00 to provide the funds necessary for the funding, purchase and redeeming those certain created, existing and outstanding indebtedness of the City of Payette amounting to the sum of \$10,000 as set forth in Ordinance No. 155 and which is due and payable out of the General Fund, Road Fund, Salary Fund and Water Works Fund of the said City.

Each qualified elector voting at said election shall indicate his choice on each of the three propositions by placing a cross (X) in the appropriate circle on such ballots.

None of such propositions shall be deemed to have carried unless assented to by a two-thirds vote of the qualified electors who are tax payers, in the said City of Payette, voting at said election.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
