

## ORDINANCE NO. 19.

An ordinance forbidding interference with city officers or impersonating peace officers, and fixing the punishment for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette.

Section I. Any person who shall molest, interrupt, hinder, or prevent any public officer of the city in the discharge of his duties <sup>or such duties</sup> as may from time to time be prescribed by the council, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars.

Section II. If the owner or keeper of, or any person within, any gambling house or room, disorderly house, or house of ill fame, within the City of Payette, shall refuse to permit any councilman, marshal, or police officer of the city to enter such room or house, it shall be lawful for any of the officers named in this section, or their assistants to enter upon and into such premises by force, by breaking doors or otherwise, and to arrest, without warrants, all suspicious persons found therein.

Any person obstructing or resisting any such officer in the performance of the duties required by this section, or any other duties already, or that may hereafter be prescribed by the city council, shall be fined in any sum not less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section III. If any person shall, in the City of Payette, personate any peace officer by wearing a star, or otherwise, such person shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section IV. All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
