

ORDINANCE NO. 198 BY W. A. HUTCHINSON.

THE

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR CUTTING AND REMOVAL OF WEEDS, GRASS, GROWTH AND RUBBISH FROM SIDEWALK SPACE AND VACANT LOTS, PROVIDING FOR THE EXPENSES THEREFOR AND REPEALING ORDINANCES NO. 93 AND ~~KX~~ 103 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Section 1. Every owner, occupant or tenant of any property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, shall be and hereby is required to cut and remove and keep cut and removed, therefrom, ~~all~~ weeds, grass, growth, and rubbish as far as the curb line, *overhanging branches of trees interfering with travel* on any street fronting or adjoining any property so owned or occupied.

Section 2. Excessive growth of weeds, grass and other vegetation ~~on~~ on or property any vacant lot or any unoccupied portion of a lot or property within the corporate limits of the City shall be and hereby is declared to be a nuisance, and the owner thereof is hereby required to cut and remove the same and for a failure so to do, he is guilty of maintaining a nuisance, and the same may be cut and removed by the City of Payette in the manner herein provided.

Section 3. If any person, firm, association or corporation, shall fail, neglect or refuse to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance, then it shall be the duty of the City of Payette to do any necessary work in cutting and removing the same and to charge the expenses of the same to the property owner, together with a ten per cent. penalty for collection thereof, shall be certified to the County Assessor and Tax Collector by the City Clerk of the City of Payette and said sum and penalty, shall be collected as other city taxes, Provided that general clean up notice shall be issued by the Mayor at least once a year.

Section 4. Ordinances numbers 93 and 103 of the City of Payette, be the same hereby are repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official newspaper.
