

ORDINANCE NO. 226

BY

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AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE CITY ENGINEER AND REGULATING THE FEES TO BE CHARGED BY HIM AND PROVIDING THAT THE SAME SHALL BE PAID BY THE PARTY APPLYING FOR THE SERVICE AND PROVIDING FOR THE KEEPING OF RECORDS BY THE CITY ENGINEER. *And Repair of etc*

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette.

SECTION 1:- It shall be the duty of the City Engineer to give surveys of lots, and the official grades and lines of streets, side-walks and alleys, with the certificates of the same when applied to for that purpose by the contractor of street work, sewer work, or by private parties when desiring to know the boundaries or grades of their property.

The City Engineer shall set permanent monuments at the intersections of all streets and at the intersection of all streets with the limiting lines of all Additions to the City of Payette where such monuments have not been set or have become displaced. (Such monuments shall be built in place and shall be made of concrete consisting of a mixture of one part of Portland cement, two parts of clean sand and sufficient water to form a compact mixture. They shall be not less than six inches in diameter, sixteen inches long, contain not less than five hundred cubic inches of material with a three/eights inch steel center marking the exact point of the survey. The top shall be below grade and at least three inches below the surface of the ground.)

It shall be the duty of the City Engineer to withhold his approval of any and all plats of Additions to the said City of Payette hereafter submitted for approval until satisfactory evidence is furnished him that monuments have been planted in the manner, ~~kind~~ ^{construction} and location described above.

The City Engineer shall have control and supervision of the ^{repair and} maintenance of all sewers, drains and cess-pools, whether public or private and shall do all other work of an engineering nature as he may be ordered to do by the Council.

SECTION 2:- Fees and compensation.

1st:::-For giving the lines or grades for lots and buildings; for each sixty feet, or less of frontage ~~three~~ ^{three} dollars; for each additional sixty feet, or less of continuous frontage up to ~~two~~ ^{three} hundred feet, Two dollars; for each sixty feet, or less of frontage above ~~three~~ ^{three} hundred, One dollar.

2nd::::- For giving the lines and grades for lots and buildings, or sidewalks where both lines and grades are asked for in the same application, for each sixty feet or less of frontage, ~~Five~~ ^{Five} dollars; for each additional sixty feet, or less of continuous frontage up to three hundred feet, Three dollars; for each additional sixty feet, or less of frontage above three hundred, One and 25/100 dollars.

3rd::::- For running lines and grades and setting the necessary stakes for streets or curbs, including profiles, cross-sections and estimates and certificates, when required for the same, at the rate of Two cents per linear foot. *No Order to be for less than 30 continuous feet.*

4th::::- For setting or replacing any street monument, Five dollars.

5th::::- For issuing and recording sewer permits and supervising sewer connections he shall receive one/half of all moneys collected for sewer connections.

6th::::- For all other services rendered the City and not specifically mentioned hereinbefore the City Engineer shall receive the sum of Five dollars per diem, and his assistants, stakes and other materials used in said work shall be paid for by the said City.

7th::::- The fees and rates of compensation enumerated above shall include the cost of all labor, assistants and materials used in connection with said surveys and shall be the full compensation for said services, and shall be paid by the party applying for the service.

PROVIDED That whenever any construction or improvement work is entered into by the said City, requiring the services of an engineer, and exceeds in cost the sum of three hundred dollars, the City Engineer shall receive for his services, in lieu of the above mentioned compensation, a commission on the total cost of the work of Five (5) percent.

SECTION 3:- The City Engineer shall keep a full and complete record of all surveys, measurements and applications for permit made, certificates of record and permits issued under the ordinances or order of the City Council, in a book or books for that purpose. A copy of all records, surveys and calculation books containing street or other city work together with all maps, plans, profiles in which the said City of Payette can in any manner be interested shall be and remain the property of said City and shall be open to public inspection. All such books, maps, plans, profiles, etc. shall be carefully preserved by the City Engineer and shall be delivered to his successor in office. All field books, plat-books and other books or printed forms designed for record shall be furnished by the said City.

SECTION 4:-Repeals Section 7, Ordinance No.156 and Section 6, Ordinance No.184.
