ORDINANCE NO. 24

An ordinance defining offenses against the peace and good order of the City of Payette, and providing punishment therefor.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette.

Section I. Any person who shall obstruct or cause to be obstructed, any of the sidewalks, streets or alleys in the City of Payette, and shall continue such obstruction for a period of twenty-four hours after notice from the marshal to remove the same, shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section II. Any person or persons who shall impair or injure, or cause to be impaired or injured, any sidewalk, street, or alley in the city of Payette, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section III. Any person who shall be guilty of riding or driving any horse or other animal, or driving any automobile or other vehicle propelled by a motor of any kind, within the limits of the city of Payette, at a greater speed than five miles an hour, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section IV. Any person who shall be guilty of any noisy, riotous or disorderly conduct, or in any way commit a breach of the peace, or anything that shall be offensive to the senses, or dangerous to the peace of the inhabitants of the city of Payette, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section V. Any person who shall be in any of the streets or in any public place in the city of Payette, in a state of intoxication, or shall make any indecent or obscene exposure of the person, or who shall, in any public place within the city, in a loud, angry, or threatening manner, use any vulgar, obscene or profane language of an insulting character, intending in any way to injure or harm any person or persons, or, whereby the peace or quiet of any of the inhabitants of the said city be disturbed, shall, upon conviction thereof, for each such offense, be punished by a fine of not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section VI. If two or more persons assemble for the purpose of disturbing the public peace of the city of Payette, or for the purpose of committing any unlawful acts within the limits of the city, and do not disperse upon being commanded to do so, by the city marshal, assistant policeman ~~deputy marshal~~, or councilman of the said <sup>town</sup> village, the persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof, be severally punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section VII. Any person who shall stand in or upon any street or sidewalk within the limits of the city of Payette, after being notified to move on, by the marshal or <sup>any assistant policeman</sup> ~~deputy marshal~~ of the said city, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine in any sum not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section VIII. If two or more persons shall meet in any street, alley, or public place in the city of Payette, to do an unlawful act upon a common cause of quarrel, and shall make advances toward it, or, do an unlawful act of violence or engage in any fight, either with or without any common cause of quarrel, or who shall act in a violent, tumultuous or riotous manner, shall, upon conviction thereof, be severally punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section IX. Any person or persons who shall keep a disorderly house or other place of business, who shall allow, permit or suffer, in any house, place, or building kept, used or occupied by him or her, within the limits of the city of Payette, any disorderly, noisy or riotous conduct, or any quarreling or fighting, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section X. Dog or cock fighting is strictly prohibited within the limits of the city of Payette. Every person who participates in such fighting, or, who aids or abets the same by his presence, shall be punished by a fine of not less than two dollars not more than twenty-five dollars.

Section XI. In all cases where a fine shall be imposed on any person for a violation of this ordinance, and the fine is not paid by such person, he may be imprisoned in the city jail not less than one day nor more than twenty days: Provided, that in case of violation of this ordinance by persons under the age of eighteen years, the police magistrate may, for the first offense, remit the fine.

Section XII. All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
