

ORDINANCE No. 262 By Thurston.

AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION AND LEVY FOR GENERAL, ROAD AND SALARY PURPOSES, AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE PAYMENT OF INTEREST ON OUTSTANDING BONDS ISSUED BY THE CITY OF PAYETTE, AND TO PROVIDE A SINKING FUND.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of 1 mill on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, together with all fines, and funds not otherwise appropriated, shall be placed in the general funds of the City of Payette.

Section 2.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property located within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of 2-3/4 mills on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the salary fund of the City of Payette.

Section 3.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday of May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of 1-1/4 mills on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the road fund of the City of Payette.

Section 4.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, a special assessment of 4 mills on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the bond interest fund and be expended in the payment of interest on the municipal coupon bonds heretofore issued by the said City of Payette.

Section 5.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, a special assessment of 1/2 of one mill on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the municipal coupon bond sinking fund, which money shall be expended in the payment of the various municipal coupon bonds issued by the said City of Payette.

Section 6.

That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of 1-1/2 mills on each one dollar of the assessed value of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the street lighting fund of the City of Payette.

Section 7.

That the sum of \$4,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the general expenses of the City of Payette, and together with all licenses, fines and other moneys not otherwise appropriated, shall become a part of the General Fund, and be used to defray the general expenses of the City of Payette and any other expenses for which the general fund may be expended.

Section 8.

That the sum of \$6,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the purpose of paying all salaries

of all officers of the City of Payette and the same shall constitute the salary fund for such purposes.

Section 9.

That the sum of \$5,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the purpose of building and keeping in repair all roads within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, and together with the road taxes shall be, and constitute the road fund of the City of Payette.

Section 10.

That the sum of \$5,285.00 is hereby appropriated from the special assessment to be levied for the year 1914 for the payment of interest on all outstanding municipal coupon bonds heretofore issued by the said City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the bond interest fund and the money shall be used for said purpose.

Section 11.

That the sum of \$1,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the special assessment to be levied for the year 1914, for the purpose of redeeming outstanding municipal coupon bonds heretofore issued by the City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the bond sinking fund.

Section 12.

That the sum of \$2,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the purpose of lighting the streets of the City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the lighting fund for such purpose.

ORDINANCE No. 262

Introduced by Mr. Thurston

An Ordinance making the annual Appropriation and Levy for General, Road and Salary purposes, and Special Assessments for the payment of interest on outstanding bonds issued by the City of Payette, and to provide a Sinking Fund.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of one Mill on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, together with all fines, and funds not otherwise appropriated, shall be placed in the General Fund of the City of Payette.

Section 2. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property located within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of two and three-fourths Mills, (2 3/4 mills) on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the Salary Fund of the City of Payette.

Section 3. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of one and one fourth (1 1/4) Mills on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the Road Fund of the City of Payette.

Section 4. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, a Special assessment of four Mills on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the Bond Interest Fund, and be expended in the payment of interest on the Municipal coupon bonds heretofore issued by the said City of Payette.

Section 5. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, a Special assessment of one half of one Mill on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the Municipal Coupon Bond Sinking Fund, which money shall be expended in the payment of the various Municipal Coupon Bonds issued by the said City of Payette.

Section 6. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1914, against all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, the sum of one and one half (1 1/2) Mills on each one dollar of the assessed value of such property, and the funds realized from such levy, shall be placed in the Street Lighting Fund of the City of Payette.

Section 7. That the sum of \$4000.00, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the General expenses of the City of Payette, and together with all licenses, fines and other moneys not otherwise appropriated, shall become a part of the General Fund, and be used to defray the General expenses of the City of Payette and any other expenses for which the General Fund may be expended.

Section 8. That the sum of \$6000.00, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first day ~~in~~ ^{of} May, 1915, for the purpose of paying all salaries of all officers of the City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the Salary Fund for such purposes.

Section 9. That the sum of ^{5000.00}~~\$8000.00~~, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the purpose of building and keeping in repair, all roads within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, and together with the road taxes, shall be, and constitute the Road Fund for the City of Payette.

Section 10. That the sum of \$5285.00, is hereby appropriated from the Special Assessment to be levied for the year 1914, for the payment of interest on all outstanding Municipal Coupon Bonds heretofore issued by the said City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the Bond Interest Fund and the money shall be used for said purpose.

Section 11. That the sum of \$1000.00, is hereby appropriated from the Special Assessment to be levied for the year 1914, for the purpose of redeeming outstanding Municipal Coupon Bonds heretofore issued by the said City of Payette, as the same becomes due, and the same shall constitute the Bond Sinking Fund.

Section 12. That the sum of ^{4000.00}~~\$3000.00~~, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, for the purpose of lighting the Streets of the City of Payette, and the same shall constitute the Street Lighting Fund for such purpose.
