ORDINANCE NO. 30.

An ordinance providing for raising revenues, and placing a license on theatres, menageries, public readings, shows, peddlers, hawkers, ⁹ draymen, ~~and laundries.~~

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette.

Section I. There is levied and shall be paid to the city clerk a license tax, as follows:

Section II. From the manager of every theatre, two dollars the first day, and one dollar per day thereafter, for each show, entertainment, or performance.

Every building used wholly or in part for the purpose of dramatic or operatic representations, plays, or performances, shall be regarded as a theatre under this ordinance.

Section III. From the keeper or proprietor of every circus, caravan, or menagerie, thirty dollars per day for the main exhibition, and six dollars per day for each side show or auxiliary tent.

Section IV. From the manager or lessee of every hall or building for each public reading, or concert for reward, the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per day, except such as are conducted for charitable or benevolent purposes, or by the citizens of the city.

Section V. From the proprietors of all other shows or exhibitions not herein enumerated, three dollars per day.

Section VI. From each and every hawker, ten dollars per day. Every person who offers goods for sale by outcry, on the street, or shall conduct business from a stand, and not having a permanent place of business within the city, shall be deemed a hawker under this ordinance.

Section VII. From each peddler, the sum of ten dollars per day, and any person or firm who shall continuously run a wagon for the purpose of peddling or selling meats, shall pay a license of five dollars for the period of three months. There are excepted from the provisions of this ordinance, farmers and persons peddling the products of their own farms and gardens, or fish, game, or milk.

Section VIII. From the proprietor of each dray or general transfer, the sum of five dollars for the period of three months.

Section IX. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in any sum not less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars.

Section X. The clerk shall be entitled to a fee of fifty cents for each license issued under the provisions of this ordinance, to be paid by the person to whom the license is issued.

Section XI. All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
