

ORDINANCE NO. 305 by Lean

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING "SECTIONS 3 and 5", OF ORDINANCE NO. 126 OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE FIXING FIRE LIMITS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE AND PROVIDING FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRES THEREIN, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1.

That section three of ordinance No. 126 of the City of Payette, Idaho passed and approved the 5th day of June, 1908, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. No ~~wooden~~ building or part of a building within the fire limits shall be raised, enlarged, or removed to another place within the same, nor shall any such building be removed into the fire limits, provided, permission may be granted by the City Council for the erection of iron clad buildings within the fire limits of the city upon application in writing, by the person or persons proposing to erect such building, signed by two-thirds of the lot owners in the block wherein such building is to be erected, requesting that such permit be granted. Provided, however, that no permit shall be granted for the erection of any iron clad building fronting upon any of the streets or avenues within said fire limits.

Section 2.

That section five of Ordinance No. 126 of the City of Payette Idaho, passed and approved the 5th day of June, 1908, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. Any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall forfeit to the City of Payette all wooden material placed or brought within said limits, in whatever shape it may be, and the same shall be removed and disposed of by the Marshal, at public auction on ten day's notice by publication in some newspaper published in the City, and any person or persons so offending, in addition to forfeiting said material shall, be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution. All money received by the Marshal for the sale of materials under this section, shall be ~~paid~~ paid into the City Treasury.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official newspaper of the City of Payette, Idaho.
