

ORDINANCE NO. 362 by Smail

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CERTAIN MINOR PERSONS FROM BEING IN, ON OR ABOUT THE STREETS, ALLEYS, PUBLIC GROUNDS AND UNOCCUPIED LOTS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO, BETWEEN CERTAIN HOURS OF THE DAY; ALSO FIXING THE DUTIES OF THE PARENTS, GUARDIAN OR OTHER PERSONS HAVING THE LEGAL CARE AND CUSTODY OF MINORS WITHIN THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO; ALSO PROVIDING FOR THE RINGING OF A CURFEW BELL; AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 16 years to be, or remain, in or on any of the streets, alleys, public grounds or any unoccupied lot or lots within the City of Payette, Idaho, after the hours of 9:30 o'clock P. M. or before the hours of 6 o'clock A. M. during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March, or after the hours of 9:30 o'clock P. M. or before the hour of 6 o'clock A. M. during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of such minor person, or whose employment makes it necessary to be in or upon such street, alley or public place during the said time.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of any person under the age of 16 years to allow or permit such child, ward or other person, under such age, while in such legal custody, to go or be in or upon any street, alley, public ground or any unoccupied lot or lots within the City of Payette, Idaho, within the time provided in the preceding section, unless there exists a reasonable necessity therefore.

Section 3: Each member of the police force of the City of Payette and any Peace officer of any county of the State of Idaho, whenever on duty is hereby authorized to arrest without warrant any person violating the provisions of Sections 1 and

2 of this ordinance, and retain such person for a reasonable time in which complaint can be made and a warrant issued and served. And it shall be the duty of such police or other peace officer so arresting and detaining said minor to forthwith notify, by telephone or otherwise, the parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of said minor, provided such parent, guardian or other person can with reasonable diligence be found within the City of Payette, that said minor has been so arrested and is being so detained.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Chief of the Police to ring or cause to be rung the fire bell of the City of Payette, Idaho at the hour of 9:30'clock P. M. each day between the first day of October and the 31st day of March, both days inclusive, and at the hour of 9:30'clock P. M. on each day between the first day of April and the ~~30th~~ day of September, both days inclusive. Provided, that the failure so to ring said bell or to hear said bell when rung shall not be a defence or excuse for the violation by any person of Section 1 and 2 of this ordinance.

Section 5: Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 or 2 of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any amount not exceeding \$100.00.

Section 6: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
