AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE FREQUENTING OF SALOONS BY WOMEN FOR IMMORAL PURPOSES, PROVIDING THE PUNISHMENT THEREFOR, AND PROHIBITING ANY SALOON KEEPER TO ALLOW SUCH FREQUENTING, AND PROVIDING THE PUNISHMENT FOR SAME, AND THE DUTY OF THE MARSHALL IN SUCH CASES.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any woman who keeps a house of assignation, prostitution, or ill-fame, or any inmate of such house of assignation, prostitution, or ill-fame, to frequent any place where spirituous, vinous, fermented, or malt liquors are sold, or any saloon, bar-room, or dram-shop, or any apartment thereto attached, for the purpose of drinking, engaging in games, soliciting trade, or for any other immoral purpose.

Sec. 2. That it shall be the duty of the City Marshall when upon his own knowledge, information and belief, or upon a sworn complaint of any citizen, that the provisions of Sec. 1 of this Ordinance are violated, to arrest the violator and upon conviction thereof, such person shall be fined any sum, not less than five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the City Jail, not exceeding fifty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. That any proprietor, keeper or owner of any place where spirituous, vinous, malt, or fermented liquors are sold, or any saloon, bar-room, or dram-shop, or any apartment thereto attached, who shall permit or allow any person described in Sec. 1 of this Ordinance, to frequent their place for the purpose of drinking, engaging in games, soliciting trade, or for any other immoral purpose, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the City Jail not more than fifty days, or both such fine and imprisonment, and upon a second conviction his license may be declared forfeited.

Sec. 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby declared void.
