AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette

Section I. That ~~the~~ corporate limits of the City of Payette be, and the same are hereby extended by including the following described territory contiguous and adjacent thereto, to wit: Commencing at a point at the Northeast corner of the intersection of ~~William~~ ^{Wilhelm} and Lynn Streets, thence West five hundred and forty (540) feet, thence North one hundred and fifty (150) feet, thence East five hundred and forty (540) feet, thence South one hundred and fifty (150) feet to the place of beginning.



ORDINANCE NO. 89.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 21 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE TAXING AND KILLING OF DOGS."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Section 1. That section 2 of ordinance No. 21 entitled "An Ordinance to Provide for the Taxing and Killing of Dogs" be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The Clerk of the City is hereby authorized to issue a license to any person applying therefor upon the payment of three (3) dollars per head for ^{each} dogs, and five (5) dollars per head for each slut or bitch, each and every year, ~~in addition to the above amount to be paid for the license~~ ^{and} the Clerk shall be entitled to a fee of fifty (50) cents for issuing said license, ~~to be paid by the person obtaining the~~

~~license~~ Provided that no person shall be allowed to purchase license for or keep more than one dog.
